# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many individuals
- 2 living in underserved or remote areas need improved access to
- 3 medications and pharmacy services. Without access to a
- 4 pharmacy, individuals face tremendous barriers to obtaining
- 5 basic, much-needed medications.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to permit residents on rural
- 7 islands and in remote areas to have access to a remote
- 8 dispensing pharmacy for the purpose of obtaining medications
- 9 regardless of the type of medical insurance that they have.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 461-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 1. By amending its title and subsections (a), (b), (c),
- 13 and (d) to read:
- "[4] §461-10.5[+] Remote dispensing pharmacy; operations.
- 15 (a) A remote dispensing pharmacy shall be under the direct
- 16 supervision of the registered pharmacist in charge of the
- 17 responsible pharmacy who shall:

1	(1)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is in
2		compliance with all laws and rules governing the
3		practice of pharmacy and remote dispensing;
4	(2)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is
5		appropriately staffed by a qualified remote dispensing
6		technician; and
7	(3)	Be responsible for the integrity of the drugs in the
8		remote dispensing machine and ensure that drugs for
9		the remote dispensing machine are provided to the
10		remote dispensing pharmacy only from the responsible
11		pharmacy.
12	(b)	[Physical set-up.] A remote dispensing pharmacy
13	shall:	
14	(1)	Be effectively secured to prevent unauthorized access
15		at all times[, and entry to the remote dispensing
16		pharmacy shall be limited] and limit entry to
17		authorized personnel only;
18	(2)	Be connected via live computer link, video link, and
19		audio link to the responsible pharmacy [and shall use]
20		through the information technology system of the
21		responsible pharmacy;

1	(3)	Conspicuously display at the remote dispensing
2		machine:
3		(A) A copy of the license of the responsible
4		pharmacy; and
5		(B) A copy of the license of the pharmacist in charge
6		of the responsible pharmacy; and
7	(4)	Have a confidential area available for communication
8		between the patient and the pharmacist at the
9		responsible pharmacy.
10	(c)	No remote dispensing pharmacy shall operate within a
11	five mile	radius of any pharmacy as defined under section 461-1;
12	provided	that:
13	(1)	This subsection shall not apply to any remote
14		dispensing pharmacy established prior to July 3, 2008
15		that has previously dispensed and will continue to
16		dispense only prescription medications acquired
17		pursuant to section 340B of the Public Health Service
18		Act, Title 42 United States Code section 256b; [and]
19	(2)	If an appropriately designated pharmacy, as defined in
20		section 461-1, is established within a five mile
21		radius of an existing remote dispensing pharmacy
22		exempted by this subsection, all appropriate measures

1		shall be taken to encourage the relocation of the
2		existing remote dispensing machine within the newly
3		established pharmacy[-]; and
4	(3)	This subsection shall not apply to any remote
5		dispensing pharmacy established in a facility operated
6		by a health maintenance organization regulated
7		pursuant to chapter 432D for the exclusive use of
8		patients served at the facility.
9	(d)	Remote dispensing pharmacies shall not provide
10	medicatio	ns to patients with health insurance coverage, except
11	for [ <del>pati</del>	ents]:
12	(1)	Patients covered by QUEST[+];
13	(2)	Patients served at a facility operated by a health
14		maintenance organization regulated pursuant to chapter
15		432D; or
16	(3)	Patients residing on an island without a pharmacy or
17		in remote areas without an existing pharmacy within a
18		five mile radius. A remote dispensing pharmacy
19		established pursuant to this subsection may continue
20		to operate in the same location if a pharmacy is
21		subsequently established on the same island as the
		Subsequences, or other restrictions of the subsequences of the sub

1	without an existing pharmacy within a five mile
2	radius; provided that the remote dispensing pharmacy
3	shall no longer be authorized to dispense controlled
4	substances."
5	2. By amending subsections (g), (h), (i), and (j) to read:
6	"(g) Each remote dispensing machine shall be operated by
7	only one responsible pharmacy. A responsible pharmacy may
8	operate [through] more than one remote dispensing machine.
9	(h) The remote dispensing machine shall have the following
10	features to ensure that it is appropriately secure at all times
11	and that all transactions are properly documented:
12	(1) Secure double-locked cabinets;
13	(2) Bar-coding or similar technology that effectively
14	recognizes the product;
15	(3) A cabinet that delivers only one bar-coded unit-of-use
16	container per [dispense,] dispensation, per
17	prescription;
18	(4) A scanner and printer that, upon releasing the unit-
19	of-use container from the remote dispensing machine,
20	[the container is scanned] scans the container to
21	confirm it is the correct container, and [with that
22	confirmation, the printer will print] if confirmed,

4	(5)	A vi	deo component that allows the patient to have a
5		"fac	e-to-face" consultation with the pharmacist at the

7	(i)	A ph	armacist shall be in charge of the remote
8	dispensin	g mac	hine and shall ensure that:
9	(1)	Writ	ten policies and procedures are developed [prior
10		<del>to u</del>	sing the machine] before the machine is used that:
11		(A)	Ensure the safe and effective dispensing of
12		•	pharmaceutical products;
13		(B)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy and
14			the remote dispensing machine [is] are operating
15			safely, accurately, and securely; and
16		(C)	Define the conditions for access to the remote
17			dispensing machine and to medications contained
18			within or associated with the machine, including
19			policies that assign, discontinue, or change
20			access to the remote dispensing machine and
21			medications;

1	(2)	A pharmacist licensed in this state and employed by
2		the responsible pharmacy has secured access to the
3		drugs in the remote dispensing machine;
4	(3)	Access to the [medications] drugs in the remote
5		dispensing machine complies with state and federal
6		laws, rules, and regulations;
7	(4)	No prescription drug is dispensed at the remote
8		dispensing pharmacy until a pharmacist at the
9		responsible pharmacy has verified the finished
10		prescription;
11	(5)	Only one prescription is dispensed and labeled from
12		the remote dispensing machine at a time;
13	(6)	All prescriptions dispensed have a label affixed to
14		the final drug container that meets the requirements
15		set forth in section 328-16 and includes the address
16		of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
17	(7)	If a patient refuses the prescription drug at the time
18		it is dispensed, the prescription drug is locked in a
19		secured cabinet;
20	(8)	There is proper inventory control at the remote
21		dispensing pharmacy and only a registered pharmacist
22		or a remote dispensing technician assigned by the

1		pharmacist in charge of the responsible pharmacy shall
2		stock the remote dispensing machine;
3	(9)	A reconciliation of the physical inventory of the
4		remote dispensing pharmacy is conducted at least
5		annually;
6	(10)	All personnel who operate the remote dispensing
7		machine at the remote dispensing pharmacy are properly
8		trained. Training shall ensure the competence and
9		ability of all personnel who operate any component of
10		the remote dispensing machine and the remote
11		dispensing pharmacy. Documentation of training shall
12		be kept by the responsible pharmacy; and
13	(11)	The remote dispensing machine is stocked accurately
14		and in accordance with established written policies
15		and procedures. The pharmacist shall check the
16		accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the
17		remote dispensing machine.
18	(j)	Controlled substances shall not be dispensed from any
19	remote di	spensing machine or remote dispensing pharmacy[-],
20	except:	

1	(1)	On islands without a pharmacy, or in remote areas
2		without an existing pharmacy within a five mile
3		radius; and
4	(2)	In a facility operated by a health maintenance
5		organization regulated pursuant to chapter 432D for
6		the exclusive use of patients served at the facility."
7	3. I	By amending subsection (o) to read:
8	"(0)	This section shall not apply to:
9	(1)	Mobile medical clinics, provided that no such clinic
10		shall operate in counties with a population less than
11		[100,000;] one hundred thousand persons; or
12	(2)	Federally qualified health centers, provided that no
13		remote dispensing pharmacy shall operate within a five
14		mile radius of any pharmacy as defined under section
15		461-1, except for those federally qualified health
16		centers that are exempt under [section
17		461-10.5(c)(2).] subsection (c)(1).
18	As used in	this subsection, "mobile medical clinic" means a
19	motor vehi	cle retrofitted for exclusive use as a medical office
20	or clinic	for medical services licensed under chapter 321."
21	SECTI	ON 3. Act 212, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
22	amended by	amending section 7 to read as follows:

- 1 "SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 2 and shall be repealed on [January 2, 2013.] January 2, 2014."
- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Report Title:

Remote Dispensing Pharmacy; Health Insurance; Prescription Drugs; Remote Areas

### Description:

Authorizes remote dispensing pharmacies to provide medications to patients with health insurance coverage; allows remote dispensing pharmacies to dispense controlled substances. Extends repeal date of section 7, Act 212, SLH 2008, relating to Remote Dispensing to January 2, 2014 (CD1).
