A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many individuals
2	living in underserved or remote areas need improved access to
3	medications and pharmacy services. Without access to a
4	pharmacy, individuals face tremendous barriers to obtaining
5	basic, much-needed medications.

- $\mathbf{6}$ The purpose of this Act is to permit residents on rural
- 7 islands and in remote areas to have access to a remote
- ${f 8}$ dispensing pharmacy for the purpose of obtaining medications
- 9 regardless of the type of medical insurance that they have.
- SECTION 2. Section 461-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 1. By amending subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) to read:
- 13 "(a) A remote dispensing pharmacy shall be under the
- 14 direct supervision of the registered pharmacist in charge of the
- 15 responsible pharmacy who shall:

1	(1)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is in
2		compliance with all laws and rules governing the
3		practice of pharmacy and remote dispensing;
4	(2)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy is
5		appropriately staffed by a qualified remote dispensing
6		technician; and
7	(3)	Be responsible for the integrity of the drugs in the
8		remote dispensing machine and ensure that drugs for
9		the remote dispensing machine are provided to the
10		remote dispensing pharmacy only from the responsible
11		pharmacy.
12	(b)	[Physical set-up.] A remote dispensing pharmacy
13	shall:	
14	(1)	Be effectively secured to prevent unauthorized access
15		at all times[, and entry to the remote dispensing
16		pharmacy shall be limited] and limit entry to
17		authorized personnel only;
18	(2)	Be connected via live computer link, video link, and
19	*	audio link to the responsible pharmacy [and shall use]
20		through the information technology system of the
21		responsible pharmacy;

1	(3)	Conspicuously display at the remote dispensing
2		machine:
3		(A) A copy of the license of the responsible
4		pharmacy; and
5		(B) A copy of the license of the pharmacist in charge
6		of the responsible pharmacy; and
7	(4)	Have a confidential area available for communication
8		between the patient and the pharmacist at the
9	e.	responsible pharmacy.
10	(c)	No remote dispensing pharmacy shall operate within a
11	five mile	radius of any pharmacy as defined under section 461-1;
12	provided	that:
13	(1)	This subsection shall not apply to any remote
14		dispensing pharmacy established prior to July 3, 2008
15		that has previously dispensed and will continue to
16		dispense only prescription medications acquired
17		pursuant to [section] Section 340B of the Public
18	g.	Health Service Act, Title 42 United States Code
19		[section] Section 256b; [and]
20	(2)	If an appropriately designated pharmacy, as defined in
21		section 461-1, is established within a five mile
22	a a	radius of an existing remote dispensing pharmacy

	shall be taken to encourage the relocation of the
	existing remote dispensing machine within the newly
	established pharmacy[-]; and
(3)	This subsection shall not apply to any remote

	patients served at the facility.

10	(h) The remote dispensing machine shall have the following
11	features to ensure that it is appropriately secure at all times
12	and that all transactions are properly documented:
13	(1) Secure double-locked cabinets;
14	(2) Bar-coding or similar technology that effectively
15	recognizes the product;
16	(3) A cabinet that delivers only one bar-coded unit-of-use
17	container per [dispense,] dispensation, per
18	prescription;
19	(4) A scanner and printer that, upon releasing the unit-
20	of-use container from the remote dispensing machine,
21	[the container is scanned] scans the container to
22	confirm it is the correct container, and [with that

1		conf	irmation, the printer will print] if confirmed,	
2		prin	ts a patient-specific label that has a bar code	
3		whic	h is scanned to confirm it is the correct label

5	(5)	A vi	deo component that allows the patient to have a

8	(i)	A ph	armacist shall be in charge of the remote	
9	dispensin	ensing machine and shall ensure that:		
10	(1)	Writ	ten policies and procedures are developed [prior	
11		to u	sing the machine] before the machine is used that:	
12		(A)	Ensure the safe and effective dispensing of	
13			pharmaceutical products;	
14		(B)	Ensure that the remote dispensing pharmacy and	
15			the remote dispensing machine [is] are operating	
16			safely, accurately, and securely; and	
17		(C)	Define the conditions for access to the remote	
18			dispensing machine and to medications contained	
19			within or associated with the machine, including	
20			policies that assign, discontinue, or change	
21			access to the remote dispensing machine and

1	(2)	A pharmacist licensed in this [State] state and
2		employed by the responsible pharmacy has secured
3		access to the drugs in the remote dispensing machine;
4	(3)	Access to the [medications] drugs in the remote
5		dispensing machine complies with state and federal
6		laws, rules, and regulations;
7	(4)	No prescription drug is dispensed at the remote
8		dispensing pharmacy until a pharmacist at the
9		responsible pharmacy has verified the finished
10		prescription;
11	(5)	Only one prescription is dispensed and labeled from
12		the remote dispensing machine at a time;
13	(6)	All prescriptions dispensed have a label affixed to
14		the final drug container that meets the requirements
15		set forth in section 328-16 and includes the address
16		of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
17	(7)	If a patient refuses the prescription drug at the time
18		it is dispensed, the prescription drug is locked in a
19		secured cabinet;
20	(8)	There is proper inventory control at the remote
21		dispensing pharmacy and only a registered pharmacist
22		or a remote dispensing technician assigned by the

1		pharmacist in charge of the responsible pharmacy shall
2		stock the remote dispensing machine;
3	(9)	A reconciliation of the physical inventory of the
4		remote dispensing pharmacy is conducted at least
5		annually;
6	(10)	All personnel who operate the remote dispensing
7		machine at the remote dispensing pharmacy are properly
8		trained. Training shall ensure the competence and
9		ability of all personnel who operate any component of
10		the remote dispensing machine and the remote
11		dispensing pharmacy. Documentation of training shall
12		be kept by the responsible pharmacy; and
13	(11)	The remote dispensing machine is stocked accurately
14		and in accordance with established written policies
15		and procedures. The pharmacist shall check the
16		accuracy of the product supplied for stocking the
17		remote dispensing machine.
18	(j)	Controlled substances shall not be dispensed from any
19	remote di	spensing machine or remote dispensing pharmacy[-].
20	except:	

1	(1)	On islands without a pharmacy, or in remote areas
2		without an existing pharmacy within a five mile
3		radius; and
4	(2)	In a facility operated by a health maintenance

16		health centers that are exempt under [section
17		461-10.5(c)(2).] subsection (c)(1).
18	As used i	n this subsection, "mobile medical clinic" means a
19	motor veh	icle retrofitted for exclusive use as a medical office
20	or clinic	for medical services licensed under chapter 321."
21	SECT	ION 3. Act 212, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
22	amended b	y amending section 7 to read as follows:

- 1 "SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 2 [and shall be repealed on January 2, 2013].
- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Remote Dispensing Pharmacy; Health Insurance; Prescription Drugs; Remote Areas

Description:

Authorizes remote dispensing pharmacies to provide medications to patients with health insurance coverage; allows remote dispensing pharmacies to dispense controlled substances. Effective July 1, 2020. (SB585 HD1)
