SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENSURING THAT ANY LEGISLATIVE EFFORT TO REPAIR THE HEALTHCARE SYSTEM IN HAWAII SHOULD INCORPORATE SUSTAINABLE WELLNESS PROGRAMS THAT ADDRESS THE UNDERLYING CASUAL FACTORS ASSOCIATED WITH CHRONIC DISEASE.

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, increases in costs related to providing healthcare for an aging population and the increasing number of people with chronic disease create a crisis for the healthcare system in Hawaii; and WHEREAS, over 72,000 individuals in Hawaii have been diagnosed with diabetes and more than 25,000 remain undiagnosed; and
9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, the leading cause of death in Hawaii is cardiovascular disease, which is responsible for more than 36% of all deaths in the state; and
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, overweight and obese individuals are at increased risk for developing many diseases, including cardiovascular disease and diabetes; and
17 18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, low-income families face an increased risk of developing chronic disease and do not have the resources necessary to avoid developing serious health problems related to such chronic disease; and
23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, there is a growing body of evidence that suggests wellness programs that promote lifestyle changes can diminish the incidence and severity of chronic disease, provide a substantial return on investment, and reduce reliance on the conventional medical care system; and
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, the state of Hawaii has a responsibility to reengineer the Nation's healthcare system to allow for the provision of adequate healthcare for future generations; and

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2 WHEREAS, Hawaii's healthcare system must be revised to allow for the provision of adequate healthcare for future 3 generations; now, therefore, 4

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth 6 7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii State 8 9 Legislature should ensure that any revisions of the healthcare system in Hawaii incorporate sustainable wellness programs that 10 address the underlying casual factors associated with chronic 11 disease; and 12

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public have access to strategies for improving individual health through lifestyle 15 16 change, including strategies relating to diet, exercise, smoking cessation, and stress reduction; and 17

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Department of 20 21 Health.
