## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A POLICY AGAINST TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AND ABUSE.

WHEREAS, teen dating violence is a pattern of teen
controlling and abusive behavior of one person over another
within a romantic relationship including verbal, emotional,
physical, sexual and financial abuse; and

6 WHEREAS, lack of dating experience allows teens to be more 7 vulnerable to dating violence where they are less likely to 8 recognize the abuse; and

10 WHEREAS, teen dating violence has become a prevalent 11 problem in high schools, junior high schools and middle schools 12 throughout our country, with one in three teens experiencing 13 some kind of abuse in their romantic relationships; and 14

WHEREAS, girls and women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence and of the young murdered each year between the ages of 15 to 19 thirty percent are killed by their boyfriend or husband; and

20 WHEREAS, recent studies have shown that teen dating 21 violence is starting at an early age with 11 to 14 year olds 22 able to identify aspects of teen dating abuse in their social 23 lives; and

25 WHEREAS, early sexual experiences can be a precursor to 26 dating violence and abuse among older teens and can perpetuate a 27 culture of acceptance of this type of behavior; and 28

29 WHEREAS, abuse and violence in intimate partner 30 relationships not only causes great individual pain, but also 31 breaks down families, communities and society at large; and 32



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WHEREAS, education is the best mechanism to stop teen 1 dating violence and is crucial to create a culture of 2 3 intolerance for teen dating abuse; and 4 WHEREAS, when a student is a victim of dating violence, her 5 academic life suffers and her safety at school is jeopardized; 6 7 now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the 10 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii State 11 Coalition against Domestic Violence develop a model dating 12 violence policy by January 1, 2010 to assist public schools in 13 14 developing policies for dating violence reporting and response; 15 and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education create public-private partnerships to provide, on an annual 18 basis, dating violence training to all administrators, teachers, 19 20 nurses, and counselors at the middle and high schools; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii public schools consider incorporating age-appropriate dating violence education 23 24 into any annual health curriculum framework for students in grades seven through twelve; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 28 the Department of Education, the Chairperson of the Hawaii Board 29 of Education, and all Hawaii public school administrators and 30 principals. 31 32 33 34
