## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

MANDATING COVERAGE OF EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES FOR INFANTS AND CHILDREN FROM BIRTH TO AGE THREE.

WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of 1 Health and Human Services, consistent access to a wide range of 2 services is particularly important for children with special 3 health care needs; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, children with special health care needs require access to a wide range of medical and support services to 7 8 maintain their physical, mental, emotional, and developmental 9 health; and 10 11 WHEREAS, early intervention services can often prevent or ameliorate the effects of illnesses, conditions, injuries, and 12 disabilities that would otherwise have a devastating impact on 13 14 affected children and their families; and 15 WHEREAS, according to The Arc of the United States, 16 17 research and successful practical experience has established that early intervention services have a positive impact on 18 19 quality of life and community participation for children with 20 special health care needs and their families; and 21 22 WHEREAS, early intervention services for children with special health care needs are a sound investment that yields 23 positive returns, both developmentally and economically; and 24 25 WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of 26 27 Health and Human Services' National Survey of Children with Special Health Care Needs, one-third of families with health 28 29 insurance coverage say that their coverage does not provide adequate, affordable access to the services required for their 30 children with special health care needs; and 31 32

No. 795 (2009); and 10

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 12 review and report findings on the benefits and services mandated 13 by relevant state and federal laws, services currently provided 14 by the State, and funding the State receives from the federal 15 government to provide these services; and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 18 submit findings and recommendations to the Legislature, 19 including any necessary implementing legislation, not later than 20 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 21 2010; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and to the
Insurance Commissioner, who, in turn, is requested to transmit
copies to each insurer in the State that issues health insurance
policies.
