SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO RESEARCH THE USE OF VEGETATIVE EROSION BARRIERS TO MINIMIZE SOIL EROSION AND PREVENT THE RESULTING RUNOFF FROM DAMAGING ROADS, STREAMS, COASTAL WATERS AND REEFS, AND TO STABILIZE STREAM BANKS, HILLSIDES, AND OTHER THREATENED SITES.

WHEREAS, the State has spent millions of dollars to install
 hard engineering structures, or shore protection structures, to
 prevent the shoreline from moving and stabilize the shoreline;
 and

6 WHEREAS, soil erosion and the resulting runoff continues to 7 compromise road safety, pollute streams and coastal waters, and 8 kill reefs; and

WHEREAS, some areas experience recurring landslides and
deteriorating stream banks and hillsides, all of which pose a
danger to life and property; and

14 WHEREAS, additional mitigation work could be completed if 15 effective methods of slope stabilization and soil erosion 16 prevention were more economical, environmentally-friendly, and 17 readily available; and

19 WHEREAS, vegetative erosion barriers planted on the contour 20 of an area requiring stabilization provide a permanent solution 21 which can avoid the costly construction of hard engineered 22 structures; and

24 WHEREAS, Vetiver grass, or Vetiveria zizanioides, is an 25 upright, tufted, deep-rooted, and very dense grass that is 26 proving to be a prime tool in providing a solution to soil 27 erosion problems in tropical areas; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009,
that the Legislature requests that the Department of Land and
Natural Resources and the Department of Transportation research



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1 the use of vegetative erosion barriers, particularly Vetiver 2 grass, to minimize soil erosion and prevent the resulting runoff 3 from damaging roads, streams, coastal waters, and reefs and to 4 stabilize stream banks, hillsides, and other threatened sites; 5 and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 8 Natural Resources is requested to submit a final report to the 9 Legislature, including any proposed legislation, not later than 10 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 11 2010; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
Land and Natural Resources and the Director of Transportation.
