# SENATE RESOLUTION

---

URGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PLAN FOR INCREASING AID AND  
ASSISTANCE TO ORGANIC FARMERS.

1 WHEREAS, organic farming practices benefit human health and  
2 advance the preservation of environmental quality; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, organic farming practices emphasize sustainability  
5 and enhance soil health; and  
6

7 WHEREAS, organic farming promotes the practice of growing  
8 agricultural products without the use of toxic substances, such  
9 as pesticides and fertilizers; and  
10

11 WHEREAS, organic farming is an important building block for  
12 maintaining and preserving the State's scenic and environmental  
13 resources; and  
14

15 WHEREAS, organic farming is also an essential element in  
16 creating economic viability and preserving the quality of life  
17 in rural and agricultural communities; and

19 WHEREAS, organic farming has gained in popularity in the  
20 State; and  
21

22 WHEREAS, local organic production, processing, and  
23 distribution cannot at this time meet the local demand for  
24 organic products; and

26 WHEREAS, the importation of organic products from the  
27 mainland and other countries can result in an increased number  
28 of invasive species in Hawaii; now, therefore,

30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth  
31 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009,  
32 that the Department of Agriculture is urged to develop a plan to  
33 increase aid and assistance to organic farmers; and

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture  
36 is urged to increase cooperation with the Hawaii Cooperative of

1 Organic Farmers, the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, and the  
2 College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources at the  
3 University of Hawaii at Manoa; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture  
6 is urged to employ all resources available including resources  
7 available through the United States Department of Agriculture  
8 for organic farming in the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of  
9 2008, P.L. 110-246; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
12 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of  
13 Agriculture, the Dean of the College of Tropical Agriculture and  
14 Human Resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa, the  
15 Executive Director of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, and the  
16 President of the Board of Directors of the Hawaii Cooperative of  
17 Organic Farmers.
