SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY TO WAIVE COPY FEES FOR ACCESS TO AND
COPIES OF JUDGES' REDACTED FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS.

1 WHEREAS, the Uniform Information Practices Act (chapter
2 92F, Hawaii Revised Statutes) allows agencies to charge fees for
3 searching, reviewing, or segregating disclosable records, and to
4 provide for a waiver of such fees when the public interest would
5 be served (section 92F-42(13), Hawaii Revised Statutes); and
6

7 WHEREAS, the week of March 15-March 21, 2009, is National
8 Sunshine Week, a national initiative to open a dialogue about
9 the importance of open government and freedom of information;
10 and
11

12 WHEREAS, the Honolulu Community-Media Council and the
13 Society of Professional Journalists, Hawai'i Chapter, as well as
14 several other open government groups, are conducting a project
15 to scan judicial financial disclosure reports and to post them
16 on the Internet; and

18 WHEREAS, the estimated costs for copying the financial
19 disclosure reports for all state judges and justices would be
20 approximately \$470; and
21

22 WHEREAS, judicial financial disclosure reports are required
23 to be filed pursuant to Rule 15 of the Rules of the Supreme
24 Court of the State of Hawaii and Rule 45(e) of the Hawaii Rules
25 of Appellate Procedure sets forth the costs and fees to be
26 collected by the appellate clerk and authorizes the Hawaii
27 Appellate Court and any judge or justice thereof to waive costs
28 and fees for good cause shown; and

30 WHEREAS, by Order of the Chief Justice dated March 13,
31 2009, the request by the Honolulu Community-Media Council and
32 the Society of Professional Journalists, Hawai'i Chapter, for a
33 waiver of the fees for copying was denied on the basis of
34 failure to state good cause for the waiver; and

1 WHEREAS, the Honolulu Community-Media Council and the
2 Society of Professional Journalists, Hawaii chapter based their
3 request for a waiver of charges on section 92F-42(13), Hawaii
4 Revised Statutes, which provides for a waiver of fees if the
5 public interest would be served; and

7 WHEREAS, in addition, section 2-71-32, Hawaii
8 Administrative Rules, allows a waiver of fees if:

10 (1) The requested record pertains to the operations or
11 activities of an agency;
12
13 (2) The record is not readily available in the public
14 domain; and
15
16 (3) The requester has the primary intention and the actual
17 ability to widely disseminate information from the
18 government record to the public at large; and

20 WHEREAS, the public interest in accessing information about
21 judges' financial disclosures would increase trust among the
22 citizenry regarding possible conflict of interest concerns;
23 now, therefore,

24
25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009,
27 that public access to the judges' and justices' redacted
28 financial disclosures, as requested by the Honolulu Community-
29 Media Council and the Society of Professional Journalists,
30 Hawaii chapter, is of sufficient public interest to warrant a
31 waiver of fees; and

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the requirements for granting a
34 waiver under the aforementioned section 2-71-32, Hawaii
35 Administrative Rules, are satisfied by the foregoing request for
36 judges' and justices' redacted financial disclosures to the
37 Judiciary; and

39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is requested to
40 waive the fees for copying judges' and justices' redacted
41 Financial Disclosure Statements, as requested by the Honolulu
42 Community-Media Council and the Society of Professional



1 Journalists, Hawai'i Chapter, for purposes of posting the same on
2 the Internet to serve the public interest; and


4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this


