HB 1061 RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES. CPC/JUD, FIN

Guarantees the operation of water and sewer services to Hawaii residents by allowing the Public Utility Commission to take necessary action and appoint receivers whenever regulated public utilities fail to

provide adequate and reasonable service.

HB 1475 RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION. CPC/JUD

Status Requires the public utilities commission to notify the public about new

regulatory proceedings via its website and changes the deadline for intervention in certain proceedings to be no later than 20 days after posting of the preceding notice on the commission's website.

HB 1792 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. CPC/JUD, FIN

<u>Status</u> Establishes the evaluative mediation program.

HB 654 RELATING TO CONTRACTORS. CPC/JUD

<u>Status</u> Prohibits the resumption of work for any person who is issued a

citation for operating without a contractor's license in good standing until the person cited holds the required licenses conducted and makes the issuance of citations and cease and desist orders mandatory.

Amends penalties. Effective 1/1/10.

HB 262 RELATING TO INSURANCE FRAUD. CPC/JUD, FIN

Status Expands the authority of the insurance division's insurance fraud

investigations unit to prevent, investigate, and prosecute (both civilly and criminally) insurance fraud beyond motor vehicle insurance cases

to all lines of insurance except workers' compensation.

HB 995 RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY. CPC/JUD, FIN

Status Authorizes the out-of-state practice of public accountancy in this State

provided that the practice is conducted through an individual with a permit or privilege to practice in this State. Establishes a privilege to

practice in this State for out-of-state practitioners.
