HB 1419 RELATING TO VETERANS RIGHTS AND BENEFITS. EBM, JUD

Status Prohibits protests within 300 feet of the entrance of any cemetery

under control of the office of veterans' services from 60 minutes before

to 60 minutes after a funeral.

RELATING TO MILITARY AFFAIRS. EBM, FIN HB 1831

Status Creates the military affairs liaison special fund within a nonprofit

entity to support the nonprofit entity's duties as the state liaison in matters relating to the military Requires adjutant general, with the governor's concurrence, to select the nonprofit entity Appropriates

funds to the special fund.

HB 556 RELATING TO VETERAN BURIAL GRANTS. EBM, FIN

Requires office of veterans' services to pay directly to a mortuary for Status

services and to transport the remains of a deceased veteran who joined the New Filipino Scouts between 10/06/1945, and 06/30/1947 and died after 06/30/1994, to the Philippines upon submission of an unpaid

invoice. Appropriates funds.

HB 560 RELATING TO VETERANS SERVICES. EBM, FIN

Status Establishes the veterans' services special fund to provide medical

> support services to Hawaii veterans. Establishes a veterans' service tax on liquor and deposits the revenue into the veterans' services special

fund.

RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. EBM, JUD HB 1523

Overrides the rulemaking authority of the procurement policy office Status

for administrative rules adopted since 1/1/03. Reinstates the office's

rulemaking authority on 1/1/11.

HB 638 Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC PROCUREMENT CODE. Requires the dismissal of a protest of an award of a contract if the reason for the protest is based upon an error in a bid that is less than one per cent of the bid amount.	EBM, FIN
HB 1012 Status	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT SHARED SERVICES TECHNOLOGY Establishes the Shared Services Technology Special Fund to allow departments and agencies to pool resources for common technology systems, hardware, and software.	EBM, FIN
HB 1207 Status	RELATING TO COMMUNITY-BASED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.  Amends sections of chapter 210D, HRS (relating to community-based economic development), to update the provision of services provided by the community-based economic development technical and financial assistance program.	EBM, FIN
HB 1309 Status	RELATING TO EMPLOYEE INCREASE TAX CREDIT Provides maximum tax credit of \$8,500 for an employer that increases employee count over the prior taxable year.	EBM, FIN
HB 699, HD1 (HSCR51) Status	RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.  Provides a tax credit for costs related to conducting medical technology research. (HB699 HD1)	HLT, EBM, FIN

HB 1503 RELATING TO LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANIES. EBM, JUD

Status Creates an optional "ingenuity company" designation for LLCs.

Requires an LLC with an ingenuity company designation to exercise its right to exclude conferred by any patent it has an interest in for a

public purpose. Establishes reporting requirements.

HB 513 RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS. EBM, FIN

<u>Status</u> Establishes requirements for contractors who bid on state construction

projects. Establishes penalties for non-compliance with such

requirements.

HB 549 RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY EBM, FIN

Status Clarifies the operation of the high technology research and

development loan and grant program to allow the State to catch up to increased federal award amounts since 1989. Gives priority to first-time small business innovation research and small business technology transfer award or contract recipients. Allows, rather than requires, the grant program to borrow funds from the Hawaii capital loan revolving

fund.

HB 1586 RELATING TO TAXATION. EBM, FIN

Status Creates a nexus standard for taxing out-of-state businesses on their

business activities in Hawaii.

HB 1405 RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. EBM, FIN

Status Amends the definition of engaging in business under section 237-2,

HRS (general excise tax), to include persons who enter into an agreement with residents of the State where the person pays a

commission for referral of potential customers.

The following bill(s) is for decision-making purposes only to insert substantive provisions into the short form bill. A public hearing will be scheduled at a later date, at which time testimony will be accepted.

HB 1704 RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT EBM

Status Short form bill relating to economic development.

As this is a decision making meeting only, NO PUBLIC TESTIMONY will be accepted.
