DEVELOPMENT.

Authorizes the Hawaii community-based economic development revolving fund to receive funding from any source. Repeals prohibition on reallocation of funds from loan program to grant program and reduces the maximum interest rate on the loans from 10% to 6%. Reduces limit on applicant's total loan balance from \$500,000 to an unspecified amount. Deletes requirement that advisory council members be reimbursed for expenses from the revolving fund.

Clarifies nonprofit determination. (SD2)

EBM, FIN RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY. SB 523, SD2 Clarifies the operation of the high technology research and (SSCR800) development loan and grant program to allow the State to catch up to Status increased federal award amounts. Provides that the High Technology Development Corporation may provide a grant to any small business in Hawaii that receives federal small business innovative research or technology transfer awards. Gives preference to qualified businesses receiving their first award over multiple award grantees. (SD2) EBM, FIN SB 537, SD2 RELATING TO AEROSPACE. (SSCR704) Establishes an aerospace advisory committee to assist the legislature and state agencies in development of the aerospace industry in the Status State. (SD2) RELATING TO GOVERNMENT SHARED SERVICES EBM, FIN SB 830, SD2 (SSCR651) TECHNOLOGY. Establishes the shared services technology special fund to allow Status departments and agencies to pool resources for common technology systems, hardware, and software. (SD2) SB 1299, SD1 EBM, FIN RELATING TO ADVANCED FLIGHT SIMULATOR TRAINING. (SSCR615) Adds businesses engaged in advanced flight simulator training for pilots, dispatchers, mechanics, or air traffic controllers to the definition Status of "qualified business" under the state enterprise zone law. (SD1) SB 623, SD1 RELATING TO TUITION ASSISTANCE. EBM, HED, FIN (SSCR708) Broadens the scope of the tuition assistance to Hawaii national guard members attending the University of Hawaii and appropriates funds for Status that purpose. (SD1) EBM, CPC/JUD RELATING TO OWNER-BUILDERS. SB 205, SD1 Increases period prohibiting sale or lease by owner-builder from 1 to 2 (SSCR521) years unless due to circumstances beyond control of the owner or Status lessee as determined by the contractors licensing board; requires that an exemption from licensing requirements is given no more than once in 3 years; clarifies violation provisions. (SD1) EBM, CPC/JUD SB 300, SD2 RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. (SSCR743) Requires liquor licensees with certain classes of licenses to carry liability insurance as a condition of acquiring and renewing a license. Status Requires liquor liability insurers to notify the county liquor commissions upon a termination, rejection, or nonrenewal of a licensee's coverage. (SD2)

## RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

Implements key recommendations of the Hawaii broadband task force by establishing the Hawaii broadband commissioner (HBC) in the department of commerce and consumer affairs (DCCA). Transfers functions relating to telecommunications from the public utilities commission to the HBC and functions relating to cable services from DCCA to the HBC. Establishes a work group to develop procedures to streamline state and county broadband regulation, franchising, and permitting and report to the legislature. (SD2)

<u>SB 687, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR769</u> ) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Clarifies procurement code to require a final decision to be issued within thirty days of the receipt of the request for hearing. Requires a judicial decision within thirty days of the filing of the application for judicial review. In either case, imposes a thirty day limit for resolution or the award of the procurement stands. (SD2)	EBM, JUD, FIN
SB 764, SD2 (SSCR782) Status	RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY. Clarifies provisions contained in long-term commercial and industrial ground leases. (SD2)	EBM, JUD
SB 101, SD1 (SSCR727) Status	RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS BY COUNTIES. Authorizes the counties to conduct criminal history record checks on taxicab drivers and applicants for taxicab driver's certificates. Eff 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EBM, JUD
SB 1276, SD2 (SSCR712) Status	RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS.  Makes various administrative and technical amendments to the small business regulatory flexibility act. Codifies the small business bill of rights. Effective 01/01/90. (SD2)	EBM, JUD, FIN
