Imposes the environmental response and energy and food security tax. Makes the executive director of the authority the energy resources coordinator. Repeals the energy resources coordinator duties.

HB 545 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT EEP JUD, FIN

Status LAW

> Requires a supplemental environmental assessment or supplemental environmental impact statement after the passage of 15 years from the date of the acceptance of the statement or the determination of a finding of no significant impact, if the proposed action is not

completed.

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT EEP WLO, FIN HB 389

Status LAW

Requires an environmental assessment for any development on lands

with an average slope of 20% or greater.
