Requires a supplemental environmental assessment or supplemental environmental impact statement after the passage of 15 years from the date of the acceptance of the statement or the determination of a finding of no significant impact, if the proposed action is not

completed.

HB 389 Status RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

EEP, WLO, FIN

LAW.

Requires an environmental assessment for any development on lands

with an average slope of 20% or greater.
