program for premises not served by a county wastewater system. Permits counties to establish gray water recycling programs in areas

served by a county wastewater system.

HB 1467 RELATING TO PROPERLY INFLATED TIRES. EEP CPC/JUD

Status Requires retail service stations to provide free tire pressure gauges and

operational tire inflation devices to enable motorists to maintain properly inflated tires so as to increase the overall operating efficiency

of existing vehicles. Provides penalty.

HB 1417 RELATING TO MOBILE BILLBOARDS. EEP JUD

<u>Status</u> Amends the restrictions on the use of mobile billboards and provides

for penalties. Exempts businesses using advertising devices used in

the daily function of the business.
