RELATING TO INVESTIGATORS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HMS, JGO HB 1101, HD1 HUMAN SERVICES. (HSCR697) Authorizes the Director of Human Services to appoint and commission investigators to investigate incidents at the Hawaii youth correctional **Testimony** facilities, and gives these investigators access to necessary information Status maintained by state and county entities. Takes effect January 1, 2050. (HB1101 HD1) RELATING TO ASSISTANCE FOR AGED, BLIND, AND HMS, WAM HB 1097, HD1 PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED PERSONS. (HSCR928) Indicates that assistance for eligible aged, blind, and permanently and totally disabled persons is available up to the amount of any legislative **Testimony** appropriation not to exceed the current statutory sixty-two and one-half **Status** per cent of the standard of need. (HB1097 HD1) RELATING TO GENERAL ASSISTANCE. HMS. WAM HB 1098, HD2 Places a twenty-four-month limit on general assistance to households (HSCR959) without minor dependents with appropriate exceptions. Requires DHS to refer general assistance recipients to the aged, blind, and **Testimony** permanently and totally disable program under specified conditions. **Status** Converts general assistance into an entitlement program. Takes effect July 1, 2020. (HB1098 HD2) RELATING TO TAXATION. HMS, WAM HB 333, HD2 Creates a state earned income tax credit funded initially with TANF (HSCR782) funds. Restricts the interest charged by tax preparers to clients who claim the earned income tax credit. (HB333 HD2) **Testimony** Status HB 1354, HD2 RELATING TO CHILDREN. HMS, WAM Appropriates Temporary Assistance for Needy Families funds and (HSCR788) general revenue funds for the Healthy Start and Enhanced Healthy Start Programs, to maintain current services, to hire additional staff and **Testimony** 

for provider training. (HB1354 HD2)
