<u>SB 1046</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION. Appropriates funds to support the Hawaii Quentin Burdick rural health interdisciplinary training program.	HRE/HTH, WAM
<u>SB 793</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PHYSICIANS. Provides loan repayment assistance to graduates of the John A. Burns school of medicine who practice medicine in underserved communities on the neighbor islands for a minimum of three to five years. Appropriates funds.	HTH/HRE, WAM
