Expedites the construction of affordable housing units by requiring ministerial permits associated with the project to be issued by the State or county within 45 days of county council approval of the project. HB 948	RELATING TO KAKAAKO.	WLO/HSG
<u>Status</u>	Increases the reserved housing requirement for a planned development to twenty-five per cent of floor space in the Kakaako community development district, mauka area for lots three acres or more in size.
