SB 254 RELATING TO TAXATION. HTH, WAM

Testimony
Provides a refundable tax credit equal to twenty-five per cent of the actual cost of a new generator or rechargeable battery that is used to power a taxpayer's life-saving or critical health-maintenance

equipment at home. Limits the maximum credit allowable for any

taxable year to \$200.

SB 174 RELATING TO TAXATION. HTH, WAM

<u>Testimony</u>

Exempts neighbor island physicians and osteopathic physicians from paying general excise taxes or unemployment insurance taxes.

**Status** 

SB 185 RELATING TO TAXATION. HTH, WAM

Testimony Assesses a surcharge on all soft drinks sold in the State.

Status

SB 427 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAXATION. HTH, WAM

<u>Testimony</u>

Excludes from the general excise tax, amounts received by a managed care support contractor of the TRICARE program for the actual cost or 02-11-09)

Status advancement to third party health care providers pursuant to a contract

with the United States.

SB 230 RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF VICTIMS. HTH, JGO

Amends the crime victims' bill of rights to include notice or waiver of notice as to an offender's unfitness to stand trial, transfer to the state hospital or other psychiatric facility, or regaining fitness to proceed.

Requires the department of health to provide notice of offender unauthorized absences.

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SB 843 RELATING TO SENTENCING. HTH, JGO

Testimony

To restore a statutory provision allowing for presentence mental health or medical examination of defendants for purposes of sentencing.

SB 930 Testimony Status	RELATING TO VOLUNTEER MEDICAL ASSISTANCE SERVICES. Provides for medical expenses and immunity from liability for licensed medical personnel providing volunteer medical services on behalf of the State or a county.	HTH, JGO
SB 1076 Testimony Status	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Establishes the Hawaii county health initiative task force to develop a comprehensive strategic health plan and to expedite the approval of new acute care facilities and medical or emergency services for the county of Hawaii.	HTH, WAM
SB 169 Testimony Status	RELATING TO HAWAII HEALTH CORPS. Establishes the Hawaii health corps that provides annual stipends to physicians and dentists who work in health professional shortage areas and shortage specialties; establishes the Hawaii health corps special fund.	HTH, WAM
SB 416 Testimony Status	RELATING TO HAWAII HEALTH CORPS PROGRAM. Establishes the Hawaii health corps program to address physician shortages in rural areas of the State; establishes a loan repayment program and an incentive plan for the recruitment of health care professionals to serve shortage areas.	HTH, WAM
SB 1074 Testimony Status	RELATING TO MEDICAL MALPRACTICE. Limits damages in medical malpractice claims to \$1,000,000 for noneconomic damages and to \$3,000,000 for noneconomic damages arising from injuries found to be catastrophic by a court. Provides income tax credit for fifty per cent of the cost of medical malpractice insurance premiums under certain circumstances. Sunset 7/31/2014.	HTH, JGO/WAM
SB 1093 Testimony Status	RELATING TO HAWAII EMPLOYERS' MUTUAL INSURANCE COMPANY. Requires Hawaii employers' mutual insurance company to provide medical malpractice insurance to physicians licensed to practice in	HTH, CPN
