organizations concerning the management and investment of funds held by those organizations. Provides additional protections for charities and also protects the interests of donors. Modernizes rules governing expenditures from endowment funds. Gives institutions ability to cope more easily with fluctuations in the value of the endowment. Updates provisions governing the release and

modification of restrictions on charitable funds to permit more efficient

SB 851, SD1 HMS, JGO Clarifies that all income withholding payments be sent through the (SSCR89) Child Support Enforcement Agency; allows the agency to disburse support by electronic deposit or debit card; allows for electronic copy **Testimony** or facsimile of a signature as proof of service for certified mail; Status clarifies lien payment and enforcement. (SD1) SB 1183, SD1 RELATING TO DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES. HMS/LBR, JGO Amends the definition of disability. Amends and adds certain (SSCR103) definitions to broaden protections against employment disability discrimination in the State. (SD1) **Testimony Status** SB 230, SD1 RELATING TO THE RIGHTS OF VICTIMS. HTH, JGO Amends the crime victims' bill of rights to include notice or waiver of (SSCR334) notice as to an offender's unfitness to stand trial, transfer to the state hospital or other psychiatric facility, or regaining fitness to proceed. **Testimony** Requires the department of health to provide notice of offender Status unauthorized absences. HTH, JGO SB 843, SD1 To restore a statutory provision allowing for presentence mental health (SSCR332) or medical examination of defendants for purposes of sentencing. **Testimony** (SD1) Status

RELATING TO VOLUNTEER MEDICAL ASSISTANCE HTH, JGO **SB 930** SERVICES. (SSCR309) Provides for medical expenses and immunity from liability for licensed medical personnel providing volunteer medical services on behalf of **Testimony** the State or a county. **Status** SB 932, SD1 RELATING TO INFECTIOUS DISEASE TESTING. HTH, JGO Proposes to expand routine human immunodeficiency virus testing by (SSCR298) health care providers to improve early diagnosis of human immunodeficiency virus by removing the requirement for health care **Testimony** providers to obtain written informed consent and to provide pre-test Status counseling prior to testing for human immunodeficiency virus. (SD1) RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. **SB 937** HTH, JGO Clarifies that the provisions of section 704-412, Hawaii Revised (SSCR304) Statutes, govern the timing and standards of decision for applications **Testimony** for conditional release or discharge from the custody of the Director of Health and includes a time frame for decisions on motions for Status conditional release or discharge. RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. HTH, JGO SB 967, SD1 Makes Hawaii's controlled substance laws consistent with that of (SSCR297) federal law and clarifies sections of chapter 329 relating to controlled substances. (SD1) **Testimony** Status SB 1040, SD1 RELATING TO SMOKING. HTH, JGO Prohibits smoking on public beaches, parks, and certain recreational (SSCR327) areas during certain community events. (SD1) **Testimony Status** SB 1142, SD1 RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS. HTH/CPN, JGO Authorizes physician assistants to sign certain documents; to provide (SSCR389) emergency medical care without supervision; to administer immunizations; to prescribe medications for patients suffering from **Testimony** human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency Status syndrome without preauthorization; limits liability of physician assistants under good Samaritan laws. (SD1) SB 1263, SD1 RELATING TO TATTOO ARTISTS. HTH/CPN, JGO Updates the regulation of tattoo artists and tattoo shops in the State. (SSCR388) (SD1) **Testimony Status**

RELATING TO WHISTLEBLOWERS' PROTECTION. SB 667, SD1 LBR, JGO Provides additional protection to public employees who report (SSCR393) violations of the law, and other improper activities such as waste, gross misconduct, incompetence, or inefficiency. Expands the DLIR's **Testimony** responsibilities regarding whistleblowers. (SD1) **Status** SB 1<u>181, SD1</u> RELATING TO LABOR. LBR, JGO Requires the department of labor and industrial relations to include in (SSCR198) certified payroll records a fringe benefit reporting form which itemizes the cost of fringe benefits paid to both union and non-union laborers **Testimony** who perform work for the construction, alteration, or repair of public Status buildings and public works. (SD1) RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. SB 1621, SD1 LBR, JGO Provides a union representation privilege to protect the functions of the (SSCR431) union as an exclusive bargaining representative to allow the union to **Testimony** perform its role in negotiations and contract enforcement; allows certification of union representatives through a card-check Status authorization; requires collective bargaining to begin upon union certification; sets certain deadlines for initial collective bargaining agreement procedures and conciliation of disputes; sets civil penalty for unfair labor practices; extends certain authorities to labor organizations representing employees for collective bargaining; allows labor disputes to be defenses against prosecution for certain violations of law. (SD1) RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY. SB 1622, SD1 LBR, JGO Requires certain employers to retain employees who were displaced (SSCR429) from an employer by divestiture through a transfer of a covered establishment to a new employer.
