PSM, JGO Requires privately owned prisons or out-of-state detention facilities (SSCR272) holding prisoners under a contract with the State to follow state freedom of information laws pursuant to chapter 92F, Hawaii Revised **Testimony** Statutes. (SD1) **Status** SB 478, SD1 RELATING TO DISASTER RELIEF. PSM, JGO Activates provisions of the State's disaster relief law to apply to (SSCR142) emergencies, except for enemy attack. Clarifies the use of the **Testimony** governor's emergency powers in response to a natural or manmade disaster. Limits the governor's powers to provide disaster relief or the **Status** length of time that the governor may provide disaster relief in specific circumstances without legislative authorization. States that, in certain cases, emergency powers in force prior to the effective date of this measure expire at the end of the 2009 regular session unless reauthorized by the legislature. SB 898, SD1 PSM, JGO Supports State Civil Defense's Shelter-in-Place initiative by exempting (SSCR221) civil liability for care homes and schools, in addition to hotels, during an officially designated emergency. PSM, JGO Directs the attorney general to coordinate a review of the impact of (SSCR341) diverting marijuana and low-level felony drug offenders out of the **Testimony** criminal justice system into treatment. (SD1) Status SB 1059, SD1 RELATING TO FIREWORKS. PSM, JGO Establishes an illegal fireworks task force to stop the importation of (SSCR222) illegal fireworks and explosives. Requires the task force to report a preliminary plan to the legislature no later than January 10, 2010. **Testimony** (SD1) **Status** SB 1147, SD1 RELATING TO STATE DISASTER RELIEF. PSM, JGO Clarifies that the governor has the authority to declare a disaster (SSCR223) emergency. Requires the state civil defense division after the governor has proclaimed a disaster emergency, to report to the governor, **Testimony** legislature, and each county mayor on the disaster, including specified Status information. (SD1) **SB 15** RELATING TO THE POWER OF ARREST. TIA, JGO Updates references to U.S. Customs and Border Protection Service and (SSCR73) Citizenship and Immigration Services to reflect current names of agencies within the federal Department of Homeland Security. **Testimony Status** SB 979, SD1 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS. TIA, JGO Revises standard for a court-issued license to drive for work-related (SSCR39) purposes. (SD1) **Testimony Status** RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. SB 1054, SD1 TIA, JGO Prohibits provisional licensees under 18 and holders of a temporary (SSCR69) permit who are age fifteen years and six months but less than eighteen **Testimony** years of age from engaging in various tasks that distract from the primary task of driving such as, the use of all cell phones (including Status hands-free devices) and all other electronic devices, consuming food or beverages, engaging in personal grooming or attempting to reach for any other object or device, while operating a motor vehicle. (SD1) RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS. TIA, JGO SB 1056, SD1 Conforms penalty for violating an out-of-service order to federal (SSCR40) regulation; provides penalty for operating a commercial motor vehicle with an alcohol concentration of an amount of 0.04 percent or more **Testimony** and imposes a penalty for operating a commercial motor vehicle with Status any amount of alcohol concentration. (SD1) **SB 973** RELATING TO TAX ADMINISTRATION. WAM, JGO Deters tax fraud and promotes uniformity in the tax system by (SSCR373) conforming Hawaii tax law to the Internal Revenue Code for preparer **Testimony** penalties and accuracy-related penalties. **Status** PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII **SB 1624** WAM, JGO CONSTITUTION TO ALLOW THE LEGISLATURE TO EITHER (SSCR372) FUND THE TAX CREDIT UNDER ARTICLE VII. (SSCR96) Creates a private right of action for a person to enforce the prohibition of obstruction. (SD1) **Testimony** Status **SB 1152** RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS. WTL, JGO Establishes a one hundred year moratorium on the development of (SSCR137) agricultural lands located in state senate districts twenty-two and twenty-three for which general planning has not commenced; sunsets **Testimony** on 6/30/2109. Status The following measure was previously heard on February 10, **2009**: **SB 477** RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RETENTION OF ATTORNEYS. **JGO** Authorizes the speaker of the house of representatives or the president **Testimony** of the senate, separately as well as jointly, to employ or retain attorneys. **Status** RELATING TO ANIMALS. WTL, JGO **SB 30, SD1** Prohibits, with exceptions, the practice of tethering dogs. Sunsets on (SSCR15) June 30, 2014. (SD1) **Testimony Status** The following measures were previously heard on February 13, 2009: **SB 488** RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY. JGO Prohibits the tethering or restraining of companion animals unless **Testimony** certain circumstances exist. **Status SB 1188** RELATING TO ANIMALS. JGO Prohibits the unreasonable or unsafe restraint of dogs and cats. **Testimony Status** RELATING TO CRUELTY TO ANIMALS. JGO **SB 763** Repeals existing prohibition against dog fighting and enacts more **Testimony** comprehensive prohibition of dog fighting and related conduct. Provides enhanced penalties. Status **SB 1222** RELATING TO THE HUMANE TREATMENT OF PET ANIMALS. **JGO** Prohibits the confinement of a pet animal on public property (with **Testimony** certain exceptions) and amends the law on animal hoarding. **Status**
