RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE.

Amends chapter 128D, Hawaii Revised Statutes (environmental response law), to be consistent with federal law, which protects innocent purchasers of, and property owners who are contiguous to, contaminated property from liability for addressing contamination they did not cause. (HD1)

RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT.

Requires certain agencies to account for sea-level rise and minimize risk from coastal hazards such as erosion, storm inundation, hurricanes, and tsunamis. Also preserves public shoreline access and authorizes the counties to account for annual shoreline erosion rates. Creates exception from shoreline setback rules for existing Waikiki beach structures and properties subject to Waikiki Beach Reclamation Agreement, to extent agreement conflicts with setback rules. (SB468
