HB 1390 Status

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, CPC, FIN

Increases the fee schedule of compensation for medical care in workers' compensation cases from 110% to 150% of the Medicare Resource Based Relative Value Scale system applicable to Hawaii as prepared by the United States Department of Health and Human

Services.

HB 1288 Status

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, FIN

Requires independent medical examinations and permanent impairment rating examinations to be performed by physicians

mutually agreed upon by employers and employees or appointed by the

director of labor and industrial relations.

HB 1279 Status

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, FIN

Requires the employer to continue medical services to an injured

employee despite disputes over whether treatment should be continued, until the director of labor and industrial relations decides whether

treatment should be continued.

HB 1676 Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS.

LAB, FIN

Requires that the collective bargaining agreement be submitted to the director of labor and industrial relations in order for the terms in the

agreement to dictate the prevailing wages with regard to a project financed through the issuance of a special purpose revenue bond.

HB 602 Status

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, EBM, FIN

Excludes services performed by an individual who is a member of a limited liability company or a partner of a limited liability partnership who has a distributional interest in the company or partnership of at least 50%, a partner of a partnership, and a sole proprietor from the definition of "employment" under the workers' compensation law.

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HB 1550

RELATING TO TAXATION.

LAB. FIN

Status

Imposes the state income tax on rollovers made by state and county employees and employees of certain tax exempt employers from

qualifying deferred compensation plans to eligible retirement plans.

HB 1738 Status

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Deletes the sunset date of 1/2/11 on the prohibition on approving

employees' retirement system benefit enhancements while an unfunded

accrued liability exists.
