RELATING TO DNA COLLECTION FOR ARRESTEES OF

PBS, JUD, FIN

Status

VIOLENT CRIMES.

Requires DNA collection from those arrested for violent crimes.

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS, JUD, FIN

Status

Requires privately owned prisons or out-of-state detention facilities holding prisoners under a contract with the State to follow state

freedom of information laws pursuant to chapter 92F, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

<u>HB 1487</u>

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PBS, HAW, FIN

Status

Requires the office of Hawaiian affairs to conduct a study on the disparate treatment of native Hawaiians and other ethnic groups in the

State's criminal justice system; makes an appropriation.

HB 1818 Status RELATING TO COGNITIVE RESTRUCTURING.

PBS, HAW, FIN

Requires the department of public safety to establish a reintegration

pilot program that combines cognitive behavioral theory with native Hawaiian holistic interventions that address domestic violence, addictions, self mastery through identity, and community connections

for successful transitions back into the community.

HB 409 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. PBS, LMG, FIN Makes clear that the office of the ombudsman has the authority to Status investigate facilities that hold Hawaii inmates, appropriates funds to conduct investigations, and makes gender neutral amendments. HB 410 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. PBS, LMG, FIN Status Requires a correctional impact statement be attached to any bill that proposes a change in the law that creates a public offense, significantly changes an existing public offense or the penalty for an existing offense, or changes existing sentencing, parole, or probation procedures. HB 969 RELATING TO PRIVATE PRISON PERFORMANCE AUDIT. PBS, LMG, FIN Status Authorizes the state auditor to conduct performance audits of private prisons housing Hawaii inmates, namely Red Rock Correctional Center and Saguaro Correctional Center in Eloy, Arizona and Otter Creek Correctional Center in Wheelwright, Kentucky in the following areas: (1) treatment and services that Corrections Corporation of America is providing to Hawaii inmates including medical, mental health, substance abuse treatment, education, vocational training, and food services; (2) visitation, videoconferencing, and telephone communication; and (3) the department of public safety's monitoring of private prisons, enforcement of contract provisions, and public access to contracts and monitoring reports. HB 1629 RELATING TO EMERGENCY SHELTERS. PBS, WLO, FIN Requires new state buildings to be evaluated for suitability as an Status emergency shelter, and requires qualifying new state buildings to be modified to serve as emergency shelters. RELATING TO PUBLIC ASSISTANCE. HB 1776 PBS, HUS, FIN Requires director of public safety to transmit monthly reports to Status department of human services (DHS) listing all newly admitted inmates during the previous month to a correctional facility. Requires DHS to identify inmates who receive public assistance, regardless of the nature of the inmate's offense, to enforce the prohibition of inmates from receiving public assistance. HB 1014 RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES. PBS, CPC, FIN Status Lowers costs for cell phone subscribers by reducing the Wireless Enhanced 911 surcharge from 66 to 46 cents. Expands the membership and responsibilities of the Wireless Enhanced 911 Board. RELATING TO FIRE PROTECTION. PBS, JUD, FIN HB 688 Makes discretionary, rather than mandatory, fire inspections conducted Status by the county fire chiefs. Provides that frequency of inspections of buildings other than public schools shall be as deemed necessary rather than every 2 years. RELATING TO FIREWORKS. PBS, TCI, JUD HB 397 Status Bans all fireworks in counties with a population of more than 500,000 persons.

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HB 398 Status RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

Provides for a statewide ban of consumer fireworks (firecrackers).

RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE. HB 383 PBS, HSG/WLO, Status Allows the counties to condition the approval of permits for the FIN construction of new residential housing in tsunami inundation zones on the installation of tsunami warning sirens or payment of impact fees. Requires the disability communications access board to identify internationally recognized symbols to be used in the event of a disaster or emergency to communicate notices to persons that do not understand verbal or written communications. RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. HB 226 PBS, JUD Status Allows a qualifying patient to possess 12 marijuana plants and 7 ounces of marijuana at one time. Prohibits identification of the site where marijuana is grown on a registry card. Prohibits a certifying physician from naming a patient's particular debilitating condition. Allows a caregiver to grow marijuana for no more than 5 patients. RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. PBS, JUD, FIN HB 1635 Establishes new recordkeeping requirements and establishes penalties; Status amends and adds definitions; requires physical examination of patient by physician; and increases penalties relating to medical marijuana. HB 1149 RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. PBS, CPC/JUD, Status Makes Hawaii's controlled substance laws consistent with that of FIN

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federal law and clarifies sections of chapter 329 relating to controlled
