<u>SB 1226</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE TOURISM SPECIAL FUND. Reduces the per cent of transient accommodations tax that is deposited into the tourism special fund from 34.2 per cent to 32.6 per cent.	TSM, WAM
<u>SB 1227</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY. Repeals the Hawaii tourism authority; establishes the department of tourism; transfers the convention center enterprise special fund, the tourism special fund, and the tourism emergency trust fund to the department of tourism; renames the department of business, economic development, and tourism to the department of business and economic development. <u>SB 1272</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Amends the transient accommodations tax to require that the first \$2,000,000 of tax revenues deposited to the credit of the tourism special fund and subsequently allotted among specific funds.	TSM, WAM
