Repeals the requirement that time share units in an existing hotel in a county with a population in excess of 500,000 are required to contain at least 60 units at least 40% of which are to be made available for sale or rental as residential apartments. SB 1645, SD1 (SSCR742) Status	RELATING TO STATE BUILDING CODE. Directs the state building code council to review studies and structural tests of bamboo as a construction material, and to recommend	WLO, CPC

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SB 715 (SSCR24) Status

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

Requires the Statewide Transportation Council to comply with county transportation and general plans, to the extent it does not impact federal funds, in the preparation of the statewide transportation plan for

projected transportation needs for a six-year period.

SB 579, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1069) Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE.

Requires that all letterheads, symbols, and emblems of the State and other political subdivisions include both state languages. Effective

SB 1141, SD2 (SSCR808) Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

Requires the department of land and natural resources to offer for sale

or exchange to leaseholders parcels of Sand Island. (SD2)

SB 1318, SD1 (SSCR764) Status

RELATING TO PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

Repeals the chapters relating to coastal zone management and state planning, and transfers the authority and functions of the office of

planning to DBEDT. (SD1)

-SB 468, SD1 (SSCR28) Status

RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT.

Requires affected agencies to account for sea level rise and minimize risks from coastal hazards such as erosion, storm inundation,

hurricanes, and tsunamis. Preserves public access and public shoreline access. Extends shoreline setback to not less than forty feet from shoreline and requires counties to account for annual erosion rates.

SB 580, SD2 (SSCR783) Status

RELATING TO FORFEITURE.

Clarifies that the forfeiture laws apply to violations of conservation and resources statutes and rules and to the protection of caves, historic

preservation, and the Kaho'olawe island reserve. Effective 7/1/2050.

SB 378, SD1 (SSCR450) Status

RELATING TO FISHING.

Establishes a fishing bag limit and size restrictions for Maui for uhu

and goatfish. (SD1)

SB 636, SD1 (SSCR470) Status

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL

RESOURCES.

Makes housekeeping amendments to section 502-33, HRS, relating to the circumstances under which an instrument requiring a reference to a

prior recorded instrument may be recorded, and to section 502-41, HRS, relating to certificate of acknowledgement for instruments filed

with the DLNR. (SD1)
