### RELATING TO MOBILE MEDICAL CARE.

HLT, PBS, FIN

Status

Authorizes the use of federal Homeland Security Grant Program funds to provide the people of the southern portion of the island of Hawaii with increased access to suitable emergency and clinical medical care.

# RELATING TO RURAL PRIMARY HEALTH CARE TRAINING.

HLT, HED, FIN

Appropriates funds to: (1) develop a statewide rural primary health care training program; and (2) support the family medicine residency program of the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine's department of family medicine and community health.

## RELATING TO PHYSICIAN SHORTAGES.

HLT, HED, FIN

Status

Establishes the Hawaii Rural Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Program to provide student loan repayments to physicians who practice in federally designated health professional shortage areas of

the state.

RELATING TO PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Makes vehicles owned and operated by nursing facilities eligible for

disabled parking license plates, placards, and identification cards.

Status

Transfers Yukio Okutsu State Veterans Home from department of health, Hawaii health systems corporation, to department of defense,

office of veterans' services.

#### RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Status

Requires insurers that offer health care coverage to the regular employees of any group or association to offer the same coverage to part-time employees working at least 15 hours per week. Requires the insurance commissioner to report to the legislature on cost-benefit.

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HB 699 Status	RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.  Provides a tax credit for costs related to conducting medical technology research.	HLT, EBM, FIN
HB 702 Status	RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAXATION.  Excludes from the general excise tax, amounts received by a managed care support contractor of the TRICARE program for the actual cost or advancement to third party health care providers pursuant to a contract with the United States.	HLT, EBM, FIN
HB 438 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Assesses a surcharge on all soft drinks sold in the State.	HLT, EBM, FIN
HB 329 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH.  Requires the State to reject all Title V federal funding for mandated abstinence-only-until-marriage programs.	HLT, EDN, FIN
HB 330 Status	RELATING TO COMPREHENSIVE SEXUALITY HEALTH EDUCATION. Requires any recipient of state funding to provide medically accurate sexuality education.	HLT, EDN, FIN

Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.
