SB92 RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING OR

JUD

REPEALING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, AND DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends or repeals various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purpose of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, and deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions.

SB119 RELATING TO THE UNIFORM FOREIGN-COUNTRY MONEY JUDGMENTS RECOGNITION ACT.

JUD, FIN

Enacts Uniform Foreign Country Money Judgments Recognition Act and in so doing, replaces and updates similar law codified as chapter 658C, HRS. Updates former law by, among other things, allocating burden of proof with respect to application of law, setting out procedure for obtaining recognition of foreign country money judgments, expanding grounds for denying recognition and allocating burden of proof to do so. Establishes statute of

SB120, SD1 RELATING TO THE UNIFORM MEDIATION ACT.

JUD, FIN

Adopts the Uniform Mediation Act. Provides certain rules for mediations. Establishes a privilege that assures confidentiality of mediations in legal proceedings. Protects integrity and knowing consent through provisions that provide exceptions to the privilege, limit disclosures by the mediator to judges and others who may rule on the case, requires mediators to disclose conflicts of interest, and assures that parties may bring a lawyer or other support person to the mediation session. (SD1)

Requires state and county agencies to ensure that a public rightof-way is available prior to the approval of any development project, subdivision, or zoning change. (SD1)

SB264 RELATING TO TOURISM.

Makes technical amendment to tourism law regarding

development of measures of effectiveness.

SB468, SD1 RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT.

WLO, JUD

Requires affected agencies to account for sea level rise and minimize risks from coastal hazards such as erosion, storm inundation, hurricanes, and tsunamis. Preserves public access and public shoreline access. Extends shoreline setback to not less than forty feet from shoreline and requires counties to account for annual erosion rates. (SD1)

SB711, SD1 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, JUD

Allows for the operation of larger articulated buses used for public transit purposes on public roadways. (SD1)

SB718, SD1 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, FIN

Requires the department of transportation and the county transportation departments to seek to reasonably accommodate access and mobility for all users of highways, roads, and streets, including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, motorists, and persons of all abilities. Establishes a temporary task force to review certain specified traffic policies and guidelines. Report to legislature in 2010 and 2011. (SD1)

HB640 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

STATEMENTS.

EEP/WLO

Excludes the installation and development of infrastructure and utilities within a public right-of-way or highway as the use of state or county lands for purposes of requiring an environmental

assessment.

HB794 RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS.

HLT. FIN

Requires the department of health, in collaboration with the department of agriculture, department of education, and Hawaii school food service, to develop nutritionally-sound public school menu plans that give students the option of a vegetarian school

lunch meal.

<u>HB813</u> RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

TCI

Designates the month of September as "language access month" to promote awareness of language access for government services and to emphasize the importance of and the need for language access in Hawaii.

## Committee RE-REFERRAL

<u>HB952</u> RELATING TO LABOR. LAB, FIN

Certifies entities as exclusive representatives absent an election where no other representatives are certified as the exclusive bargaining representatives. Requires immediate collective bargaining between parties once entities are certified as exclusive

representatives.

HB979 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. FIN

Untilizes certain special funds to support invasive species control and mitigation and to promote reforestation and sediment run-off

mitigation.

<u>HB1665</u> RELATING TO HAWAIIAN FISHPONDS. HAW, FIN

Prohibits the sale of public lands on which government-owned

Hawaiian fishponds are located.

HB1692, HD1 RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG, FIN

Restricts state low-income housing leases in certain cases, to no

more than 5 years. (HB1692 HD1)
