It has also helped me to be able to speak to the Indigenous People of this state and help preserve the history of their identity.
- (b) I perceive the role and responsibilities of being a member of the Board to be knowledgeable of the all areas that the Board covers especially in one's chosen field; to know the styles, methods, materials and pertinence of the subject piece, and to honestly, to one's highest

degree, designate those properties that tell the complete and true story of these Islands.

- (c) I believe I am qualified to serve on this Board through my experience sitting on it for the past four years, for having worked in the field of architecture for the past 35 years working in the styles of numerous cultures and having the opportunity to travel the globe to personally experience them, but primarily because I love these Islands and their Native Culture and sincerely wish to do my utmost to preserve that culture that it will not be lost.
- (d) I hope to promote the recognition of more Kanaka Maoli sites that their importance is documented and passed on to future generations. This is not to say I don't place importance on the other cultures that have made these Islands what they are today, but there is a danger in the loss of the host culture, and we know that that is why visitors continue to come here. They bear a spirituality that many are not aware of, and it is spirituality of which the people of this world are in dire need given these difficult times. It is perhaps the greatest gift these Islands have to offer.
- (e) I am passionate about my art and global history.
 I am passionate about these Islands.
 I am a good, kind and honest person.

If you have no passion, you don't belong on this, or any government, Board. If you are not good, kind and honest, you will miss those qualities in the simplest structure.

- (f) As President of the Native Hawaiian Chamber of Commerce, I was
 influential in getting the Nomination Forms completed and presented to
 the Historic Places Review Board. I recused myself from the vote, but to
 have this important site added to the State Register and, hopefully, the
 National Register, was important for me and, more significantly, for the
 Native Peoples of these Islands.
- (g) While it may be evident that I have a deep appreciation and respect for the Kanaka Maoli Culture, I also have a deep respect for the cultures that have formed these Islands and their multi-faceted effects. To not respect these would be dishonest and a mockery to history, and that is not what this Board is about. As I mentioned in Statement (f), if there is a conflict of interest, I let it be known and recuse myself, though I have been allowed to voice my view on the subject. I take my position on this Board as a privilege entrusted to me by the people of this state, and have pledged myself to that trust. That is the highest commitment I can make.
