Chair Taniguchi and Members of the Committee:

My name is Linda L. Smith and I serve as Governor Lingle's Senior Policy Advisor. It is my pleasure to appear before you today in support of the re-appointment of Mr. Mark G. Valencia to the Hawaii Civil Rights Commission.

I have known Mr. Valencia for the past several years when he initially applied for a position as a policy analyst. His legal skills were exactly what was needed in the policy team and, although I had not known him previously, we asked Mr. Valencia to become a policy analyst. Mr. Valencia ably served from June 3, 2004 to April 30, 2005 in this role helping Cabinet agencies with their testimony and legislation that was being considered before the House and Senate.

Mark has always shown a fair and balanced approach to any task presented to him. He was particularly valued as a member of the policy team for his thorough legal review of pending bills and his ability to perform detailed legal historical research to help us analyze the implications of various proposals being considered in the Legislature

Currently Mr. Valencia is an attorney in private practice with Case Lombardi & Pettit, a position he took after leaving our office to return to the private sector. He has brought the same thoughtful, balanced, and objective approach to his role as a Commissioner on the Civil Rights Commission as he did while a member of the staff and now as a private attorney.

Mark's fairness and objectivity are hallmarks of what people expect when they bring a matter before this Commission. He has given generously of his time to help the Commission address the difficult and important cases before it. He has also worked

Nomination of Mark G. Valencia to the Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission

The Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission (HCRC) has enforcement jurisdiction over Hawai'i's laws prohibiting discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations, and access to State and State-funded services. The HCRC carries out the Hawai'i constitutional mandate that no person shall be discriminated against in the exercise of their civil rights. Art. I, Sect. 5.

The HCRC supports the confirmation of the nomination of Mark G. Valencia to the Commission. Mr. Valencia meets the requirements of HRS § 368-3 of having "knowledge and experience in civil rights matters" and "a demonstrated commitment to the preservation of the civil rights of all individuals." Mr. Valencia is a director and shareholder in the law firm of Case Lombardi & Pettit, with a civil litigation practice that includes employment law matters. His litigation has included both plaintiff and defense practice, in contract, insurance, tort, product liability, employment, and other cases. One emphasis of his representation of employers in labor and employment law is the importance of compliance with fair labor practices and equal employment opportunity laws, both state and federal. He understands that fair employment practices benefit employers as well as workers and society at large.

Mr. Valencia's commitment to preservation of civil rights of all individuals is forged through his personal and family experience. A first generation American citizen of Honduran national origin, the son of a Hispanic father and African American mother, Mr. Valencia and his family have experienced racial, color, and ancestry discrimination. Born out of this experience is a sensitivity to discrimination and a recognition of the importance of civil rights protections for all people.

Mr. Valencia has a record of service, having served on the Ethics Committee of the Kuakini Medical Center, and as a volunteer for the Professionals for Drug Free Kids Project and the Read Aloud America Program. His commitment to serve is demonstrated in his record of military service.

Mr. Valencia has served as a Commissioner since April 2007. Commissioner Valencia has contributed to Commission discussions and deliberations that have been collegial and serious. He has been conscientious and engaged, attending meetings and actively participating in Commission business.

Mark G. Valencia's experience and expertise make him a valued member of the Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission. He will serve the public interest and the people of Hawai'i well. We support confirmation of his nomination.



Testimony in opposition to the confirmation of Mark Valencia to the Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission (GM355)

Pride At Work Hawai'i, an affiliate of the Hawai'i State AFL-CIO whose mission is to advocate for full equality for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) workers and to build mutual support between the labor movement and the LGBT community, strongly opposes the confirmation of Mark Valencia as a commissioner for the Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission.

Commissioners are supposed to be committed to protect the civil rights of *all* individuals. By opposing Hawai'i House Resolution 7, which requests that the US Congress establish a non-discrimination policy based upon sexual orientation for members of the US armed forces, and by opposing HB444, which would create civil unions for same-sex partners, Mr. Valencia has demonstrated his unwillingness to protect the civil rights of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people. Both of these issues - supporting economic justice and equality for LGBT couples and their families, and opposing discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in the US armed forces - are clear indicators of anti-gay bias, making Mr. Valencia an inappropriate choice to serve on the HCRC.

Every day, LGBT people in Hawai'i face discrimination in their workplaces and in their communities. They rely on the HCRC to protect and defend them from such discrimination. This is not an issue which is open for debate. If Mr. Valencia is confirmed to serve on the HCRC, LGBT citizens can no longer count on the Commission to uphold their legal rights, as his recent actions on the Commission have shown. Surely there are other community leaders who support the civil rights of all Hawai'i's people and who would be better candidates for the HCRC. Please vote against confirming Mr. Valencia to the HCRC.



Testimony in Opposition to the Appointment of Mark G. Valencia as Civil Rights Commissioner (Governor Message 355)

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in opposition to the Appointment of Mark G. Valencia as Civil Rights Commissioner.

In establishing the Civil Rights Commission, the Legislature declared that "the practice of discrimination because of race, color, religion, age, <u>sex, sexual orientation</u>, marital status, national origin, ancestry, or disability in employment, housing, public accommodations, or access to services receiving state financial assistance is against public policy." [Underlining added.]

Section 368-2 states in pertinent part: "The members appointed to the commission shall be selected on the basis of their knowledge and experience in civil rights matters and on the basis of a demonstrated commitment to the preservation of the civil rights of all individuals." [Underlining added.]

Mark G. Valencia fails to meet the requirements set forth in Section 368-2. He lacks experience in civil rights matters, and he has not demonstrated a commitment to the preservation of civil rights of all individuals. To the contrary, he has a demonstrated commitment to limit or deny civil rights based on sex and sexual orientation.

He voted not to support House Resolution No. 7, "Requesting the United States Congress to Establish a Policy of Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sexual Orientation for Members of the United States Armed Forces."

In "Mitchell V. Helms and The Modern Cultural Assault on The Separation of Church and State" by Derek H. Davis states: "Conservative religious groups, convinced of the connection between Supreme Court decisions and school violence, have set about once again to find ways in which to gain official sanction for the 'return' of religious practice to public school classrooms" and cites an article written by Mark G. Valencia, *Take Care of Me When I am Dead: An Examination of American Church-State Development and the Future of American Religious Liberty*, 49 SMU L. Rev. 1579, 1632 (1996).

When a person takes the oath of office, he places his hand on the Bible and swears to uphold the Constitution; he does not put his hand on the Constitution and swear to uphold the Bible. Mark G. Valencia has a track record which shows that he does the latter rather than the former. Consequently, he is not qualified to serve as a Civil Rights Commissioner.

I oppose the appointment of Mark G. Valencia as Civil Rights Commissioner.
