Mr. Chairman:

Thank you for the opportunity to introduce myself to you and your committee. My name is Creighton Goldsmith and I have been privileged to live in this great state for over 38 years. In my professional life I am a Chief Inspector for U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), the largest federal armed law enforcement agency in the Department of Homeland Security. I have served as chief of operations for both the Honolulu seaport and airport. In my capacity I have earned a rare opportunity to understand the integrated nature of air and intermodal transportation, tourism and its critical importance to the economy of this state.

I am currently in my third year of serving with the Civil Defense Advisory Council and General Robert Lee, Director Ed Teixeira and Chairman Gerald Coffee. I must tell you that this state is indeed fortunate to have these outstanding men in this critically important agency. I view my role on the council as a representative of Oahu to provide background and advice on the needs of the community to the Governor, General Lee and the outstanding employees of State Civil Defense and to carry the message for preparedness back to my network of friends and community colleagues.

With nearly 40 years of experience I have served on the mainland, in the Middle East, Asia and South America. I recently returned from 6 months in Sri Lanka (Ceylon) where I saw first hand how a civil war, a tsunami and poverty have torn the fabric of society. I saw that island government's frail responses to the critical needs of its people and its economy. I would not let that happen in Hawai'i.

Over the past years I have built working relationships and cooperative efforts with State and City agencies, federal agencies, airlines and shipping companies along with the military and U.S. Coast Guard to ensure that Hawai'i remains safe from both external threats and natural disasters. I am critically aware of Hawai'i's remote location and the time it would take to recover from a serious natural disaster due to the nature of air and sea shipping. I have lived through two major hurricanes, significant power outages and external threats to our state's safety and security.
