In consideration of GOVERNOR MESSAGE 376 - SUBMITTING FOR CONSIDERATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF MAUI AND LANAI, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, JAMES S. BALLAO M.ED.

It is with pleasure that the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) recommends Senate confirmation on the appointment of James S. Ballao M.Ed. to the Maui/Lanai Islands Burial Council.

The Island Burial Councils were established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to determine the preservation in place or relocation of previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites and to determine Hawaiian cultural and lineal descendancy claims for specific burials. State law requires that Island Burial Councils be established for Hawaii, Maui/Lanai, Molokai, Oahu and Kauai/Niihau islands, comprised of representatives from specific geographic regions and representatives of developer/large property owners.

James S. Ballao M.Ed. was nominated to serve as the Wailuku District representative on the Maui/Lanai Islands Burial Council. If confirmed, James S. Ballao M.Ed. will serve until June 30, 2013.

James S. Ballao M.Ed is currently employed as a special needs Hawaiian Studies educator at Baldwin High School. He brings a diverse educational professionalism to the council. The Department notes that James S. Ballao M.Ed. currently serves as a valued member of the Maui/Lanai Islands Burial Council.

The Department greatly appreciates your consideration of James S. Ballao M.Ed. and strongly recommends his confirmation to the Maui/Lanai Island Burial Council.
