The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism strongly supports the nomination of Stephanie S.H. Crivello to the Community-Based Economic Development (CBED) Advisory Council.

Ms. Crivello has served faithfully and well for four years as a member of the CBED Advisory Council. Her expertise and experience with community economic development on the Island of Molokai has proven to be a valuable resource for the department, Community-Based Economic Development Program, and for the Molokai community. Her past and present accomplishments, as a long-term substitute teacher for Alternative Students-Molokai High School from 2001 to 2002, and her current service as Interim Executive Director of the Molokai Enterprise Community (a nonprofit), provide invaluable insight towards the needs, culture and vision of our Neighbor Island communities.

Since its inception, the CBED grant and loan revolving fund and technical assistance program has committed nearly four million dollars to more than 170 community-based organizations Statewide. Approximately 77 percent of program funds provided financial assistance to Neighbor Islands.

Most recently, in FY 2008, Ms. Crivello has been a passionate advocate for community empowerment. She has played and will continue to play, with your confirmation, an important part in the support of community economic development and capacity-building through the CBED Advisory Council. In 2008, eleven communities were awarded grants, totaling more than \$113,000. Projects ranged from updating a marketing website for Native Hawaiian producers to

strategic planning for a charter school, in Puna on the Big Island, to launch an eco-tourism business based on the area's existing assets. Revenue from this venture to be put towards sustaining educational activities at the school.

Again, we are proud to support the nomination of Stephanie S. H. Crivello for a second term to the Community-Based Economic Development Advisory Council.
