## RELATING TO OBLIGATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TRUST FUND

Chair Oshiro and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify on H.B. 1015.

The Department of Accounting and General Services supports this bill because it will enable individuals on the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands' waiting lists to purchase and occupy their homes more quickly.

Currently, State-funded housing projects are required to have full capitalization funding on hand before proceeding. This requirement unnecessarily limits the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands in providing homes to its beneficiaries. The Department of Hawaiian Homes Lands initiates projects which generate income streams by selling or leasing completed homes or improved lands. Changing the law as this bill proposes would be consistent with the private industry standard that allows a developer-contractor to be bonded and to proceed with only those funds needed to complete an

identifiable phase of the project. This will allow State-financed affordable housing projects for the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to be expedited.

Chair Oshiro, Vice-Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaiian Homes Commission and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands support HB 1015, which will enable the department to encumber construction contracts with the peak value of the proposed development.

This bill affords DHHL the same opportunity and ability as private sector developers who maximize their revenue towards the production of affordable housing through effective cash flow and construction management. DHHL's housing projects currently must have full capitalization funding on hand before construction contracts are encumbered and this requirement is a challenge in projects like ours where an income stream is derived by the sale of completed homes. This requirement also delays the delivery of affordable homes to

beneficiaries, which in turn, opens affordable homes and rental units on the open market.

With the current economic conditions in Hawaii, this bill will boost construction employment opportunities and will compliment the anticipated federal stimulus funding. HB 1015 is consistent with the State's goal of doing more with less.

Additionally, last month, Fitch Ratings assigned an 'A-' rating to DHHL's \$50 million revenue bonds and cited DHHL's ability to successfully manage its revenue stream to reflect sound debt service.
