PURPOSE: The purpose of this bill is to repeal section 348-9, Hawaii

Revised Statutes (HRS), which establishes the Statewide Council on Independent

Living in the Department of Human Services.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) strongly supports this Administration-sponsored bill. For the State to be eligible to receive Federal financial assistance, the Federal Rehabilitation Act, title 29 United States Code, section 796d, requires the State to establish a Statewide Independent Living Council, which cannot be established as an entity within a state agency.

Section 348-9, HRS, establishes a Statewide Council on Independent Living in DHS. Section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was well-intended, but is unnecessary and has resulted in confusion. Section 348-9 is unnecessary because

the Statewide Independent Living Council can be established through the State's

Title VII State Plan that each state is required to have to receive Federal funds under

Title VII of the Federal Rehabilitation Act. The State currently receives more than

\$296,000 in Federal funds for independent living services.

Repealing section 348-9 and relying instead on the State's Title VII State Plan to establish a Statewide Independent Living Council, will satisfy the State's Title VII requirement.

If this bill is not passed, public confusion will continue.

HB1103- Repeals Section 348-9, that establishes the Statewide Council on Independent Living.
