RE: HOUSE BILL NO. 1369 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII

Chair Yamane, Vice Chair Nishimoto, and Members of the Committee:

My name is Jim Tollefson and I am the President and CEO of The Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii ("The Chamber"). The Chamber supports House Bill No. 1369 relating to the University of Hawaii.

The Chamber is the largest business organization in Hawaii, representing more than 1,100 businesses. Approximately 80% of our members are small businesses with less than 20 employees. As the "Voice of Business" in Hawaii, the organization works on behalf of its members, which employ more than 200,000 individuals, to improve the state's economic climate and to foster positive action on issues of common concern.

This measure establishes a loan repayment program and housing stipend program for University of Hawaii medical school graduates practicing in counties with a population of less than 500,000 for a minimum of 6 years..

The quality of healthcare that Hawaii has enjoyed for years is now in jeopardy. It is on the verge of declining because healthcare providers are no longer being paid for essential services at a level sufficient to cover annually increasing costs. The health care system must be maintained and challenges must be addressed.

Therefore, The Chamber supports improvements to the quality of our health care system that will increase long term care capacity and access statewide. We believe providing incentives, such as establishing a loan repayment program and housing stipend program will help address the shortage of doctors, especially on the neighbor islands, as well as keep the providers in Hawaii.

In light of the above, The Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii supports HB 1369. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
