I am testifying on House Bill 1429 HD1 which makes an appropriation of TANF funds for the Hawaii National Guard About Face family of programs.

We support House Bill 1429 HD1 as it allows the Department of Human Services to expend federal TANF funds in coordination with the Department of Defense to continue operations in fiscal year 2009-2010 and fiscal year 2010-2011 for the Hawaii National Guard About Face family of programs.

Currently, yearly expenditure of federal TANF for the About Face family of programs amount to \$7.2 million. Hopefully, the Department of Human Services will be able to increase their funding support to \$9.5 million for expansion of these worthwhile community oriented programs administered by the Department of Defense.
