This bill extends EZ tax credits and exemptions for businesses engaged in the manufacturing of tangible personal property or in the producing or processing of agricultural products, for an additional seven years. It also allows the receipts, sales, and employees of a business's establishments in all enterprise zones located within the same county to count towards qualification requirements and allows renewable energy producers to qualify for the EZ program. The Department appreciates the intent of this measure; however, given the current fiscal difficulties, we oppose its enactment at this time.



HOUSE BILL NO. 1682, HD1 RELATING TO STATE ENTERPRISE ZONES

Chairperson Morita and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on House Bill No. 1682, HD1. The purpose of this bill is to improve the state enterprise zone program by allowing limited liability companies to be included under the definitions of "qualified businesses" and "service businesses", by extending the enterprise zone tax credits and exemptions for businesses engaged in the manufacturing of tangible personal property or in the producing or processing of agricultural products for an additional seven years, and by allowing the receipts, sales and employees of a business's establishments in all enterprise zones located within the same county to count towards qualification requirements.

The HDOA acknowledges the merit of this measure as we believe that agriculture producers would benefit from an extension of enterprise zone tax credits and neighborhood revitalization programs that create agricultural jobs. However, we caution that an extension of tax credits and exemptions in this difficult economic period may be detrimental to the state.
