Title of Bill:

HB 0181 RELATING TO THE FEDERAL GRANTS REVOLVING FUND.

Purpose of Bill:

Renames the existing Federal Grants Search, Development, and Application Revolving Fund as the Federal Grants Revolving Fund. Allows funds in the Federal Grants Revolving Fund to be used to monitor grant execution, ensure compliance with grant requirements, and audit grant expenditures.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education strongly supports this measure. This is a "housekeeping" item, and is not requiring any new appropriations. The current statute, HRS Section 302A-1405, restricts the use of the revolving fund such that it can be only used for "search, development and application" of federal grants. The proposed language expands the use of these funds to not only the obtaining of additional federal grants, but also to support the monitoring of grant execution; ensuring compliance with grant requirements; and auditing of grant expenditures.

The Department has already hired a grant writer, and is hiring a grant coordinator to assist schools with searching, writing and applying for federal grants.

However, with over \$200 million in annual expenditures of current federal grants in the Department of Education, there are significant needs in the areas of monitoring of grant execution; ensuring compliance with grant requirements; and auditing of grant expenditures.

The Department has established a Federal compliance office, reporting to the Superintendent. Availability of support from this revolving fund will enable the Federal compliance office with a means to implement greater oversight on the implementation of Federal grants.

TESTIMONY BY GEORGINA K. KAWAMURA DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FINANCE STATE OF HAWAII TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 181

February 2, 2009

RELATING TO THE FEDERAL GRANTS REVOLVING FUND

House Bill No. 181 amends the name of the existing Federal Grants Search,

Development, and Application Revolving Fund to the Federal Grants Revolving Fund and
expands the use of the fund to include monitoring of grant execution, ensuring compliance
with grant requirements, and auditing grant expenditures.

We are opposed to this bill. As a matter of general policy, this department does not support the creation of any special or revolving fund which does not meet the requirements of Sections 37-52.3 and 37-53.4 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. Special or revolving funds should: 1) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries of the program; 2) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 3) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. With the proposed expansion of the use of this fund, it is difficult to determine whether the fund will be self-sustaining.
