Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health

- Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) appreciates the intent of this bill, but must
- 2 respectfully oppose it as it is currently drafted.
- 3 **Fiscal Implications:** Significant but unquantified additional work hours will be required which cannot
- 4 be absorbed at the current staffing levels.
- 5 **Purpose and Justification:** The Department of Health introduced H.B. 1120, Relating to Medical
- 6 Liability, as an Administration-sponsored measure to address the urgent need to provide comprehensive
- 7 medical tort reform. On behalf of the citizens of the State of Hawaii who are affected by this medical
- 8 crisis and are awaiting our collective action, the department cannot support the establishment of a
- 9 working group that will serve to distract from the primary need to pass meaningful legislation this
- 10 session.
- The DOH is further opposed to this bill as it will require the DOH to establish a working group
- to study the concept of health courts, including the responsibilities to provide all administrative,
- technical, professional, and clerical support to the working group. This specialized area will include
- 14 considerable technical medical insurance, judicial, and constitutional research which is beyond the scope
- of expertise within the DOH. Additionally, the considerable provision of professional and support

- services that would need to be dedicated to fulfill the requirements stipulated in this bill will require
- 2 significant additional work hours that cannot be absorbed at current staffing levels. Funding does not
- 3 exist to cover the additional costs.
