This measure seeks to create a high technology industrial park dedicated to cultivating military technology businesses. This measure provides various tax incentives.

The Department of Taxation (Department) takes <u>no position</u> on this measure; however must <u>oppose the revenue loss</u> anticipated by this measure.

NOT FACTORED INTO EXECUTIVE BUDGET

Though the Department supports the intent of cultivating Hawaii's high technology industry and leveraging means to attract further federal funds, the Department cannot support the tax provision in this measure because it is not factored into the budget. The Department points out that this legislation has not been factored into the Executive Budget and has not been prioritized as a means of tax relief this legislative session. The Department must be cognizant of the biennium budget and financial plan. This measure has not been factored into either. Given the forecasted decrease in revenue projections, this measure would add to the budget shortfall.

REVENUE IMPACT

The tax component of this measure will result in a revenue loss of \$6 million per year beginning in FY 2012.
