**STATEMENT OF THE ILWU LOCAL 142 ON H.B. 697 AND H.B. 698
RELATING TO TEMPORARY HEALTH INSURANCE FOR UNEMPLOYED PERSONS**

The ILWU Local 142 supports H.B. 697, which establishes a temporary health insurance program for unemployed individuals, and H.B. 698, which temporarily provides health insurance to individuals who are uninsured due to the loss of a job for reasons other than voluntary separation, discharge for work-related misconduct, or work stoppage caused by a labor dispute.

The unemployment rate in Hawaii is the highest it's been in a decade. Thousands of Hawaii residents are without jobs or have reduced work hours. Most are collecting unemployment benefits, but many have exhausted their eligibility for benefits. With seriously reduced income, most of them find themselves and their families without health insurance, placing an additional burden on hospitals and insurance plans.

H.B. 697 and H.B. 698 will help to close that gap and provide coverage to those who would otherwise be uninsured. While the Legislature may believe the State cannot afford such expenditure in this difficult economic climate, the alternative of having more people uninsured yet requiring health services which cost must be borne by taxpayers or passed on to employers and employees by insurance companies is unacceptable as well.

We have no preference for one bill over the other. However, we believe only one program can be implemented.

Dear Chair Yamane, Chair Mizuno and Members of the Committees:

The Hawaii Medical Service Association (HMSA) appreciates the opportunity to testify on HB 698 which would create a safety net for individuals who have lost their employer based health care coverage due to the economic downturn.

While Hawaii can boast a lower than average uninsured rate due to the Prepaid Health Care Act (PHCA), it also must be noted that when the economy is not faring well and unemployment is rising the PHCA cannot assist those who have lost their health care coverage along with their jobs.

While we believe that this program could be extremely worthwhile, it is important to note that engaging in a contracting process with the Department of Human Services can be lengthy and may not provide the rapid relief necessary in today's economy. Given the similarity of goals between this measure and HB 697, the Committees may want to consider passage of HB 697 instead of HB 698 since HB 697 utilizes existing health care infrastructure in the form of QUEST and Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA) plans and would likely be able to be implemented more quickly.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on HB 698.
