In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 138/HOUSE RESOLUTION 111 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO REMOVE THE KA'OHE HOMESTEADS FROM THE GEOTHERMAL RESOURCE SUBZONE DESIGNATION

House Concurrent Resolution 138/House Resolution 111 requests the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to remove the geothermal subzone designation applied to the Ka'ohe Homesteads located in the Puna District of the Big Island. The Department does not support these resolutions due to the lack of compelling reason(s) at this time. Further, given the uncertainties of the fiscal situation, the impact on the Department's operating budget, the need to direct new efforts to apply for federal stimulus grants, which will come with additional reporting requirements, the Department's personnel and fiscal resources are being spread thin.

The Department notes that a request to modify or withdraw lands from existing subzones must be done in accordance with §13-184-10, Hawaii Administrative Rules. The modification of the boundaries of an existing designated geothermal resource subzone may be initiated by the Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) or any property owner, State mining lease applicant, geothermal mining lessee, or person with an interest in real property that is within the designated subzone. Compelling information should be provided with such a request. The Board may modify the boundaries or withdraw an existing designated geothermal subzone after conducting procedures pursuant to Chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes (Administrative Procedure) and only upon finding by a preponderance of the evidence that the area is no longer suited for designation.
