Chairpersons Tsuji and Ito and Members of the Committees:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Resolution No. 177. We are strongly opposed to this resolution as it is based on unsupportable assumptions about agriculture and unnecessarily create a rift within the agricultural community; not only between large and small farmers, but also between organic and traditional producers, and producers of different types of agricultural products.

Further, it would eliminate the farmers' right to choose what to grow, and require the Department of Taxation to conduct a potentially costly and complicated study with no funds. The underlying assumption in this resolution is that farming operations grossing more than \$500,000 annually are corporations supported by federal crop subsidies and focused on export markets. This is not accurate. There are a number of farms of this size that are family farms focused on serving the local market.

I SUPPORT HR177 with one amendment. Remove item (6) line 34, pg 2 relating to the inclusion of the co-existence document as a reference for this resolution. This document does nothing to move us towards healthy, organic, food self-sufficiency. With the exception of papaya, no gmo crops in the State of Hawaii are allowed or permitted for human consumption, making the co-existence document moot. The referenced document also runs counter productive to the effort to support small and organic farmers and the intent of this resolution.

Small farmers are too often excluded from access to agricutlural lease lands, from HDOA funding resources and programs. It is small farmers and organic farmers who put food on our tables, in our local open markets, and restaurants, and it is these farmers who will lead us towards food security and self-sufficiency.
