#### **SUPPORT WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENTS**

I'm Shannon Wood speaking on behalf of the Windward Ahupua'a Alliance speaking in support of HCR18/HR 20 as well as to offer amendments.

WAA is committed to supporting the preservation & restoration of cultural and historical sites. As an organization, it is actively involved in two other non-profits which would fall under the scope of this resolution.

In fact, neither of the two groups I'm involved with nor any of our Ko'olaupoko partner groups nor HEA are listed.

By inserting the words *such as* before listing two or three groups, the implication is that all groups would be welcome to join the task force.
