TESTIMONY ON HR 37/HCR46: URGING CONGRESS TO PROTECT AND MAINTAIN PROGRAMS, LAWS, REGULATIONS, AND POLICIES THAT ASSIST VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The Hawaii Immigrant Justice Center ("HIJC"), formerly known as Na Loio, provides statewide free legal services, case management, community education, and advocacy in the public interest for indigent immigrants, refugees, and other vulnerable persons. Among those persons, we represent special immigrant juveniles (minors who have been abandoned, neglected or abused), victims of human trafficking, victims of crimes, and others in their attempt to obtain legal status in the United States. In the past year, HIJC helped over 1400 individuals in immigrant-related matters.

The Justice Center supports both the House Resolution 37 and House Concurrent Resolution 46. Both measures resolve to urge Congress to protect and maintain programs, laws, regulations, and policies that continue funding and to assist victims of domestic violence; and enable providers of services to meet expenses necessary to continue to operate their programs.

The challenge presented with any decline in government funding would be to maintain our level of current assistance with fewer staff and potential layoffs while the critical needs of low income people are higher than ever. These services are crucial to prevent family violence, help individuals remain with their families, prevent victims from remaining in their homes to avoid deportation and help them and their children escape from abusive situations, among others.

Please pass HR 37 and HCR 46.
