The Hawai'i Tourism Authority (HTA) strongly supports the provisions of S.B. 1167, S.D. 2, which propose housekeeping amendments to the Hawai'i Tourism Authority law, but opposes the provisions of S.B. 1167, S.D. 2, which subjects the contractor operating the Hawai'i Convention Center to the Procurement Code. Among the housekeeping amendments being proposed are:

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Consolidation of Authority for Appointment of Officers and Employees

Reporting of Contracts and Agreements

Section 201B-7 requires the HTA to provide notice to the Speaker of the House of Representative and the President of the Senate of any contract or agreement valued at \$25,000 and over on the same day that notice is given to the Governor. The bill proposes to amend the law to provide that the HTA shall periodically submit a report of the contracts and agreements entered into by the Authority. The HTA currently submits, through its Executive Director's report to the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate, notice of *all* contracts and agreements entered into by the HTA. The bill proposes an amendment to conform to this practice.

Relating to the Hawai'i Convention Center Contractor and the Procurement Code

HTA opposes SECTIONs 1 and 2 of S.B. 1167, S.D. 2, which subject the contractor operating the Hawai'i Convention Center to the Procurement Code. The operations of the Convention Center require the contractor to expedite many of the contracts and purchases that are required to carry out the activities and events at the Center in a timely manner. The process and procedures for source selection and contract formation in part III of the Code would be cumbersome for the operator of the Convention Center and therefore not add to or improve the efficiency or effectiveness of the Center's operations.

Relating to sunset provisions

Finally, S.B. 1167, S.D. 2 proposes to repeal sections 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Part I of Act 58, on June 30, 2010, which will sunset the provisions of the HTA law relating to the following:

- HTA's exemption from the supervision of accounts facilitates the HTA's deposit of special funds in interest-bearing accounts and its ability to make payments from those accounts;

The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism is offering comments on SB 1167 SD2, for clarification purposes only.

Our comments are in regards to Section 3 of the measure, as it deletes from Section 201B-7 (a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, the need to report on contracts or agreements valued at \$25,000 and over to the governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the president of the senate. The amended language states that the authority is to periodically report contracts and agreements entered into by the authority with no dollar amount affixed. We suggest that the word *periodically* be further defined and that having to report all contracts and agreements of any size may be overly burdensome to the authority.
