- 1 **Department's Position:** The Department strongly supports this measure.
- 2 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 3 **Purpose:** This bill provides state consistency with federal laws on the liability of bona fide prospective
- 4 purchasers and contiguous property owners for contaminated real property.
- 5 **Justification:** The Department of Health supports this bill in its entirety. This bill has been
- 6 successfully amended by replacing its contents with the language of the Administration bills, and S.B.
- 7 No. 935 (companion to H.B. 1117, introduced by Representative Morita), along with stakeholder
- 8 identified amendments pertaining to all appropriate inquires. This bill revises Chapter 128D to include
- 9 two provisions similar to those in 42 United States Code section 9601 added by the federal Small
- Business Liability Relief and Brownfields Revitalization Act in 2002. In doing so, this bill provides
- consistency between state and federal environmental liability laws. It sets forth conditions under which
- innocent contiguous property owners or "bona fide prospective purchasers" are not held liable for
- damages or costs related to contamination of real property not caused by either party. This bill also

- successfully reflects the results of extensive stakeholder involvement led by the Department over a two-
- 2 year period. This bill closely matches the needs identified, discussed, and endorsed by the community.
- It is for the above stated reasons that the Department supports this bill as written.
