S.B. 1260, RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION FEES

Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health

Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) acknowledges this measure has merit, 1 2 however, given the current economy, it would not be prudent to pursue enactment at this time. 3 **Fiscal Implications:** We estimate that about \$230,000 additional revenues will be collected depending 4 on the actual amount of pollutants emitted by the affected sources. Revenues go to the clean air special 5 fund which has restricted uses under federal law. 6 **Purpose and Justification:** This bill removes the maximum limit on annual fees assessed to any one air pollution covered source. Covered sources are presently charged an annual fee based on the amount 7 of air pollutants emitted in the previous year up to 4,000 tons for any one pollutant. This measure 8 9 removes the 4,000-ton emissions cap which is felt to be inequitable for the smaller sources and a 10 disincentive for very large sources to reduce emissions. 11 The fee program was established in 1992 to support air program activities pursuant to Title V of

the Clean Air Act. The emissions cap was an option that Title V made available to states in designing their fee program to lessen the annual fee burden on the very large sources. Retaining the cap provides

1	continued relief for the electric generating facilities, and also their customers for which increased fees
2	are ultimately charged.
3	Records indicate that at most times only the HECO Kahe Generating Station on Oahu would be
4	affected by the removal of the emissions cap. Kahe's fees would increase about 45%, roughly from
5	\$510,000 to \$740,000 per year, depending on the actual amount of emissions emitted.
