Purpose:

The purpose of this Act is to repeal the performance standards

review commission.

Department's Position:

The Department of Education (Department) supports S.B.

162 as the Department continuously reviews the

implementation and effectiveness of the performance

standards to determine whether or not the standards should be

modified. Since the creation of the Commission for

Performance Standards in 1991, the Department has assessed

its standards to ensure that the standards reflect the needs of

students as well as meet the educational goals adopted by the

Board of Education.

Since 1997, the Department has faithfully fulfilled this

requirement and convened Performance Standards Review

Commissions every four years as specified. In addition, the

Commission's reports have consistently confirmed and

reinforced the independent findings of the Department. For

this reason, the efforts of the Performance Standards Review Commission are duplications to those of the Department.

The total spent by the Department for the 2006 Performance Standards Review Commission was approximately \$70,000. The expenditures included travel expenses (i.e., airfare, rental cars, mileage, and parking), per diem, meals and refreshments for the 11 commissioners attending the 12 full-day meetings, and the printing and distribution of the final report.

Given these times of fiscal austerity, the existing requirement places unnecessary financial and personnel resource burdens on the Department and reduces the resources available for direct support to the schools.
