Although the Community Care Foster Family program was originally created for Medicaid patients to provide a more comfortable residential setting while being more affordable, private pay patients must not be penalized.

Family is a core value. No one should be forced to live separately from a loved one simply because part of a program's patient eligibility is determined by the number of private pay patients vs. Medicaid patients in any given facility. The familial relationship should be a consideration when space is available in the same care home. Adequate safeguards must be developed to ensure the program's goals are not thwarted, ensuring that preference is not given to those who can pay more for the privilege of living under the same roof as their family member.
